

LOCAL ROADWORKS

Council staff have commenced road works on the Wandering Narrogin Road to widen the road. Road users are urged to obey the safety signs and drive safely through the road works.

FIRE SAFETY — FIREBREAKS

The Shire of Cuballing requires that property owners maintain their properties in a fire safe manner with fire breaks or reduced fuel loads from 1st November 2017 until 15th May 2018.

For owners of rural or larger rural residential properties this means installing and maintaining a 2.5 metre wide fire break.

For smaller town site properties this means mowing down long grass across all the property.

Shire staff will be inspecting firebreaks around the Shire commencing on 1st • November.

COUNCIL SHORTS

- Council will farewell Deputy CEO Rick Pares on 2nd November 2018. Rick commenced in the role in January will take up private business opportunities in Perth. In his time in the role Rick has made a valuable contribution to the Shire's administration operations.
- Council will assist the Cuballing Men's Shed with the installation of

a new transportable disabled toilet facility at the Cuballing Men's Shed at 97 Alton Street. The Cuballing Men's Shed purchased the unused facility at a recent auction and now Council will assist in completing plumbing and electrical connections and the building and sewage licence requirements.

- Council will pursue the sale of two properties in Cuballing who have extensive outstanding rates. One of the properties has unpaid rates for three consecutive years.
- Council is to continuing to pursue funding for the construction of Aged Persons Units in Cuballing. The Shires of Wickepin, Kondinin, Corrigin, Narrogin and Cuballing are working together to achieve funding for aged persons units across the region.
- Swimming pools and spas are required to be inspected every four years to ensure that the pool safety fence meets requirements. Council staff are currently completing inspections of swimming pools across the Shire of Cuballing and owners will be contacted to set up suitable times for an inspection. Of the inspections completed to date, all fences have been found to be compliant.
- The shire's new message board has arrived. The board has been advertising local events in Cuballing but will be used in road works across the Shire.

EQUESTRIAN NEWS

Dryandra Pony Club hosted a very successful Two Day Event at Dryandra Regional Equestrian Park over the weekend. Competitors travelled from as far afield as Esperance, Kalgoorlie, Eucla, Kalannie and Moora as well as from Metropolitan and South West clubs with 120 horses and riders taking part in the event.

All competitors completed a dressage, showjumping and cross country phase over the weekend with classes ranging from a jumping height of 45cm to jumping 1.05m.

Landcare matters

Hotham-Williams sub-catchment update







NRM is the management of natural resources such as land, water, soils, plants and animals. It brings together land use planning, water management, biodiversity conservation and sustainability of industries such as agriculture, mining, tourism, fisheries and forestry.



Landcare Grants Available NOW

Funding is available to assist landowners with on-ground landcare and bushcare works focussing on these priority areas:

- On-farm native vegetation, wildlife habitats and native species fodder
- Protection and/or enhancement of habitat of Numbats as well as Woylies, Chuditch, Malleefowl, Redtailed Phascogale and Matchstick Banksia
- Eligible activities can include fencing to protect bushland and waterways or link bushland patches, weed control, feral animal control, dieback disease management and seeding of areas for restoration



Applications close 12 November 2018 and projects must be completed by 31 May 2019.

Rabbit Virus due for Release



PHCC will be working with the community to release the RHDV-K5 rabbit haemorrhagic disease virus during the first two weeks of November. The virus will be release at approx. 25 sites across the Hotham-Williams subcatchment with the help of landholders, community members and local Government.

PHCC is working closely with the Department of Primary Industry and Regional Development (DPIRD) and the Peel Harvey Biosecurity Group on the release.

The release of the virus coincides with media releases by DPIRD to ensure pet rabbits are vaccinated and advising owners to speak with their local vet if they have any queries.
