

COUNCIL SHORTS

Planning Approval

Council approved an Application for Development Approval for an Outbuilding, Ancillary Dwelling and a Patio at 49 Popanyinning East Road, Popanyinning.

Change of Date for June Meeting

With one Council position vacant, and another Councillor on extended leave, Council must be mindful of ensuring that there is always a quorum available to deal with Council business. Cr Dowling advised that she will be unavailable for the scheduled date of the June meeting. Council has decided to postpone the June meeting to 30 June 2023.

Councillor Attendance Fees

Every Year the Salaries and Allowances Tribunal is required to inquire into and determine the range of fees, to be paid under the Local Government Act 1995 to elected council members for attendance at meetings; expenses to be reimbursed under the LG Act to elected council members; and the range of allowances to be paid under the Act to elected council members.

Council is required to consider the SAT determination and set fees for the coming financial year. Council considered the SAT Determination and decided to support the CEOs recommendation that the following fees apply for the 2023-24 year:

- a Shire President Meeting Fee of \$250 per Council Meeting;
- a Councillor Meeting Fee of \$165 per Council Meeting;
- a Shire President's Allowance of \$10,000;
- a Deputy Shire President's Allowance of \$2,500;
- a Committee Meeting Fee of \$65 per Committee Meeting or prescribed meeting;
- 6 an annual ICT Allowance of \$500 per Councillor; and
- all travel, and childcare costs upon presentation of evidence of the actual costs.

Annual Report

Council adopted the Annual Report for 2021-22. In addition to the audited financial statements and a range of mandatory reporting requirements, the Annual Report and provides a report by each of the Shire President and CEO, and highlights the Shire's achievements for the year.

Annual General Meeting of Electors

Following the adoption of the Annual Report Council has set a date for the Annual General Meeting of Electors. This meeting provides the opportunity for the community to receive the annual report and ask questions directly of Council. The meeting will be held at 6.30pm on Friday 30th June 2023 at the Council chambers.

Audit Action Plan

The Auditor as part of its report identified 3 issues of significance. Council adopted an Audit Action Plan to address these issues. A copy of the action plan has been submitted to the minister and a copy is available on the Shire's website.

2023 Council Elections

A further reminder that Local Government Elections will be held on 21st October 2023. There is one vacant position following the resignation of Cr Dowdell earlier this year and two Councillors completing their terms. If you are thinking about it you may wish to come along to one or two Council meetings to see how they work. Council meetings are open to the public.




Green Card Training

Thank you to the 14 community members, landholders and PHCC staff who recently attended Green Card training in Boddington to learn skills to apply biosecurity hygiene when working in natural areas. Phytophthora dieback is one of the threats discussed in the course that can have a devastating impact to bushland areas by reducing biodiversity, food and shelter for native fauna.

The practical component of the training involved effectively washing down and inspecting a vehicle to ensure that weed seeds and pathogens such as dieback are not being transported into sensitive bushland areas. Thank you to Joe and Josh from Terratree for travelling to Boddington to deliver the course and the Boddington Shire for allowing us to use their depot for the wash down demonstration.

Birds On Farms Relaunched

Back from a 25 year hiatus BirdLife Australia's Birds on Farms project has re-launched in WA!

In 1995 Birds Australia inaugurated the Birds on Farms project, aiming to answer important questions about bird distribution, population health and habitat use on private rural land.

Over a two-year period, 110 farms were surveyed in WA by 138 volunteers, recording a total of 179 bird species. Now, after 25 years the Birds on Farms Project is being relaunched to build upon the successes of the original 1990s Project.

The Project aims to engage with landholders and birdwatchers particularly in the WA wheatbelt to identify bird species, their behaviour, ecology, and habitat use.

Surveys are done seasonally at 2 ha sites within farms, with the help of experienced birdwatchers and interested landholders.

Hotham-Williams sub-catchment update



Lost River?

Many of you would follow one or more of the 'Lost' pages, which share breadcrumb trails about places and people in the past that live on in photo albums and peoples' memories.

Some of the photos you see here are from the Lost Pingelly Facebook page, reminiscing about the weir (now in ruins) on the Hotham River where it flows past the Hotham River Nature Reserve. Just 8km south of Pingelly, it was the site of the original town water supply and there was a pool nearby that was often used by locals for swimming, picnics and other gatherings.

The Hotham River at this location is one of the eight restoration sites we have been telling you about, which are all part of the Hotham-Williams River Action Plan (RAP).

The channel of the Hotham River here is wide in parts, transitioning to a highly active meandering form, with eroding and retreating banks and considerable sediment deposition. Riparian vegetation has been impacted by the highly saline water and is dominated by scattered trees and exotic ground covers. Salt-loving samphires have provided some stability and habitat by colonising the bed and banks. Also the gorgeous ruby saltbush (pictured).

The Hotham-Williams River Action Plan is a long term project and although this site is not in our initial priority projects, eventually as funding is available, our intention is to carry out weed control, revegetation and bank stabilisation as well as coordination of protective fencing with the neighbouring properties.

Although not what it once was, the Hotham River still provides a picnic spot during a visit to the Nature Reserve, particularly during the shoulder seasons of 'first dew' and 'flowering'.





Peak of Cuballing's league success

APART from Wally Sidebottom, other men who helped achieve that historic 1961 grandfinal win were Ron Wiese, John Walsh, Ron Gabrielson, Verm Cavanagh, Chris O'Brien, Steve Mourish, Bob Woods, Athol Pritchard, Colin Hall, Lance Ugle, Greg Kelly, Stan Hewton, Brian Colbung, Wally Kickett, Kevin Hunter, Kelvin Kickett, Parnell Dempster, John Brailey and Gerry Walsh. It will be noted that

It will be noted that five of those men also played in the seconds grand final win in 1959. Ron Gabrielson as captain and coach for 1962/63 almost led the team to another premiership in 1962 but they were defeated in the grand final by West Arthur who outscored them heavily in the final quarter.

However, Ron had the 18 players of that league side functioning as a "well oiled machine" and they completely outclassed Towns taking out their second premiership.

Cuby achieved another premiership under the captaincy of Ron Redman. In a mighty finish that year the league side came from fifth place to secure third premiership after winning 11 of the last 12 games played.

The windup dinner in the Cuby Hall that year

was a happy affair.

In 1967 former South
Fremantle and State
player of the late 40s,
early 50s Charlie Tyson
took over the Cuballing
A grade side marked by
youth, enthusiasm, speed
and courage. He helped
them to become runners
up to the minor premiers
and runners up in the
premiership contest

when Wickepin defeated them in the grandfinal.

Then came the peak of the Cuballing league side's success when they achieved four successive premierships from 1968 to 1971.

The first two were gained with captain/coach Sandy Pearse in charge. When the 1969 grand final was played the team members must have been really inspired by having Wally Sidebottom back in town for the occasion.

The captain/ coach in 1970 was Dave Williams from Kyneton, Victoria and he saw them through to a convincing victory over Wickepin which according to the Observer's report was more memorable for a couple of good brawls in the third and fourth quarters than for the out-

standing play. 1971 saw the A team

1971 saw the A team performing under Cuballing champion Gerry Walsh, who was named Fairest and Best player during the A and B grade grandfinals in 1959 and 1961. He was also named fairest and best for Cuballing A grade and the Narrogin Tigers during the 1960's.

Cuballing thrashed Williams in the premier ship clash in 1971 in what was dubbed the most one sided grand final ever seen on the Narrogin oval.

After a relatively quiet year in 1972, Cuby league side won both minor premiers and premierships in 1973. Colin Beard the man with South Fremantle and Richmond experience led them to greatness that year.

He won the Sunday Times medal for best footballer in the league and runner up J. Mustard of West Arthur won the Leo Graham medal. In that premiership battle, John Whitford marked "gloriously" and the Kickett brothers, Bentley, Fitt and Langoulant dominated the packs.

Under Rod Duckworth, fresh from leading Dudinin to a premiership, Cuballing A grade contested their ninth grand final in 1974. On the day when Cuby's B team downed Towns to achieve premiership and when John Whitford led out the A team for his 200th game. Hopes for victory were high, however Wickepin were jubilant when they overcame Cuby's strong combination of veterans and young players.

The 'wonder years'

FOLLOWING his success with the B team in 1974, Ray Browne the B team in 1974, Ray Browne led Che in 1975, during which he achieved his 200th game in August. Ken Leslie from South Fremantle was appointed coach in 1976. Under both Ray and Ken the league side performed extremely well in the qualifying rounds but were eliminated each year in the

semi-finals.

Ken Leslie was re-appointed in 1977 when for the last time

Cuballing A grade took out the premiership. After the close fought tussle against Pingelly that saw Cuballing triumphant, Cuby's physical strength and experience were decidine factors in a necel.

1978 was another reasonably gover for the league side with Ker Leslie kicking 100 goals for the season. They came third in the qualifying rounds but were thrashed by Max Stewart's Railways in the semi-final.

In 1977, Ray Browne who had

the Cuballing Tavern. been quite successful as coach, was appointed to Max Stewart's position with Railways. It was to be his "annus horriblis". Cuballing A side overwhelmed his new charges, 29 - 17 that July and Railways were premiers under Max Stewart.

whom he had coached to a premiership in 1982. Returning to Cuballing's "wonder years". The period was like a mag nesium flare that shone, suddenly and very brightly in a dark night. But just as suddenly the flare was extinonished.


