Background

In previous years Council has granted approval for closure of the Shire Administration Office over the Christmas/New Year period. Purpose

To advise Council of Environmental Health inspections that have been carried out in the district during the month of October 2007.

Water Samples

Water Samples were taken at the Dryandra Village on the request of the Department of Conservation and Environment, two of the first sample had a high count but subsequent samples have complied and there is no problem.

Environmental Protection Act 1986 Environmental Protection (Noise) Regulation 1997

Council has received a letter of complaint, with various supporting documentation, from a resident in Popanyinning regarding dogs barking continually at the Popanyinning Kennels, being at Lot 136 Lord Street, Popanyinning. Council staff have investigated the complaint.

Letters were sent to owners of land neighbouring the Popanyinning Kennels asking them to write to Council advising if there is a problem from the barking dogs. From the responses received, four (4) written and (4) verbal, only one person has said there is a problem but that person did not give there name and was not prepared to put their comments in writing. Staff believe there is insufficient evidence at this stage to instigate any further action (eg. legal action). If the complainant is not satisfied with Councils decision they may take further action under section 79 of the Environmental Protection Act 1986.

79. Unreasonable noise emissions on premises

(1) A person who on any premises uses or causes or allows to be used any equipment in such a way as to cause or allow it to emit, or otherwise emits or causes or allows to be emitted, unreasonable noise from those premises commits an offence.

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- (2) Subject to subsection (3), a prosecution for an alleged offence under subsection (1) may be instituted only by
 - (a) any 3 or more persons, each of whom is the occupier of premises and claims to be directly affected by that alleged offence;
 - (b) an authorised person; or
 - (c) a police officer.
- (3) A prosecution for an alleged offence under subsection (1) may be instituted by less than 3 persons if a person who is the occupier of premises and claims to have been directly affected by that alleged offence satisfies the court in which that prosecution is sought to be instituted before the accused is required to enter a plea that the circumstances are such that
 - (a) less than 3 persons were affected by that alleged offence;
 - (b) other persons affected by that alleged offence are unable or unwilling to join in the institution of that prosecution for economic or other reasons not related to the question of whether or not that alleged offence was committed; or
 - (c) the enjoyment of the premises occupied by him was affected by that alleged offence in a degree substantially greater than was the case with other premises so affected, and that the prosecution is not of a frivolous, vexatious or unreasonable nature.

CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICERS RECOMMENDATION

- Council informs the complainant of the Popanyinning Kennels that investigations have revealed that at present there is insufficient evidence to take the complaint further, however is she is not satisfied with Councils decision on the matter she can pursue further action under section 79 of the Environmental Protection Act 1986.

Background

Correspondence from the WAPC advising that the planning application has been refused.

The application was previously presented to the August 2007 meeting of Council, at the meeting Council resolved not to support the application.

In reaching that decision Council took into account that the Shire of Cuballing Town Planning Scheme No 2 (clauses 1.6 & 4.2) has a general presumption against the further breakdown of agricultural land.

Council also acknowledged WAPC Planning Policy DC 3.4, subclause 3.2.1(a), that states that the WAPC may approve a subdivision where a significant natural or man-made feature already physically divides the proposed lots, however believes that in this instance whilst the existing lot is already divided by a road, approving the subdivision would create an undesirable precedent for subdivision of neighbouring properties which are in a similar situation.

Comment

The WAPC's reasons for refusal of the application are:

- 1. The proposed subdivision is inconsistent with the 'Rural' zoning of the land in Council's Town Planning Scheme. The purpose and intent of this zoning is to preserve the area's current rural use and density of development. Subdivision in the manner proposed would create the potential for additional building development and the introduction of increased non-rural activity in conflict with the zoning objectives.
- 2. The proposed subdivision does not comply with the Commission's Policy DC 3.4 Clause 3.2.1(a) which provides for subdivision where a significant natural or man-made feature already physically divides the proposed lots and an undesirable precedent would not be set on the grounds that Williams Road is

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- not considered a significant physical barrier and approval would set a precedent for the subdivision of surrounding lots.
- 3. The proposal represents an unplanned breakdown of land holdings, which would be detrimental to the use of the land for rural purposes.
- 4. Approval to the subdivision would set an undesirable precedent for the further subdivision of surrounding lots.

The applicant has 28 days in which to appeal to the WAPC to review its decision.

Correspondence from the WAPC advising that the Commission is prepared to endorse the planning application subject to compliance with certain conditions.

The application was previously presented to the July 2007 meeting of Council, at the meeting Council resolved to support the application subject to the following conditions:

- Suitable constructed road access must be provided to all lots by way of existing traffic corridors/road reserves;
- Proposed Lot 3 to become a conservation lot and be subject to a conservation agreement with the Department of Environment and Conservation, with at the very least a covenant to be placed on the certificate of title to ensure that any proposed clearing of vegetation be restricted to a building envelope, property access and agreed fire management measures; and
- Revegetation and tree planting be carried out on the remaining lots consistent with the Shire of Cuballing Local Planning Policy Hotham River Environs and for Natural Resource Management.

Comment

The conditions of approval imposed by the WAPC for the application are:

- 1. Arrangements being made with the local government for the upgrading and/or construction of Calcoran and Daylesford Roads.
- 2. A Conservation Covenant with a relevant agency, pursuant to section 129BA of the Transfer of Land Act 1893 (as amended) is to be placed on the Certificate of Title of proposed Lot 3 advising of the existence of a restriction on the use of the land to protect areas identified for. Notice of this restriction to be included on the Deposited Plan. The Conservation Covenant is to state as follows: "Native vegetation located on the lot is to be protected from detrimental impacts caused by stock or farming and clearing activities".

Background

Planning application to subdivide Lot 131 Bunmulling Road, Popanyinning, into three separate Lots, has been submitted by the property owners Bertram & Julie Gray.

A planning application has previously been received for this Lot and was presented to the February 2006 meeting of Council for consideration. On that occasion Council resolved:

"That the Western Australian Planning Commission be advised:

- That Council is prepared to support the subdivision application on the proviso that the portion of Lot 131 on the northern side of Bunmulling Road, and 0.463ha in size (which is smaller than the permitted minimum lot size without a reticulated water supply in accordance with TPS No 2 clause 5.12.6), is ceded to the Crown at no cost and incorporated into Reserve 11342 (Lot 126); and
- That an Environmental Impact study be undertaken because of the low-lying nature of the land."

Following the above resolution, and in their deliberations on the matter, the WAPC deferred a final decision on the application until 29 December 2006, and requested the proponents to provide a drainage management plan to the satisfaction of the Shire of Cuballing by this date. As the condition was not complied with the application was subsequently refused by the WAPC.

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Comment

The application was been referred to Councils Town Planning Consultant, Mr Trevor Moran, and his comments follow:

The applicant proposes to subdivide Lot 131, Bunmulling Road into 3 lots, each over 4 hectares in area. Lot 131 is in the rural residential zone of TPS No 2. The objectives for the rural residential zone seek to provide for rural smallholders and a low density rural environment in close proximity to the rural townsite zone, provided that all lots are adequately serviced with the necessary infrastructure. A further objective is for houses to precede outbuildings on rural residential lots.

Clause 5.12.6 provides for a minimum lot size of 4 hectares unless the lot is connected to a reticulated water supply. Clauses 5.12.7 and 5.12.8 require planning approval for any subsequent development and the protection of vegetation from development where possible. Accordingly, the proposal meets the requirements of the Scheme in terms of minimum lot size. However, as a condition of subdivision the applicant should be required to inform prospective purchasers of the requirements of Clauses 5.12.7 and 5.12.8 of the Scheme and that no outbuilding will be approved unless a single dwelling is existing on the property or is to be constructed at the same time (Clause 4.2 (c)).

Also, as there is some concern over the low lying nature of the terrain, an engineers report should be required as a condition of subdivision advising on appropriate floor levels for subsequent development on each of the proposed lots.

In addition to Mr Moran's comments, another matter for consideration is access to the proposed lots. The existing property already has access from Bunmulling Road and it is expected that this will remain the access for proposed Lot 1. Lot 2 will also have access from Bunmulling Road, however Lot 3 will need to be from unmade road reserve Durham Road. Whilst this road reserve is virtually cleared and used by neighbouring rural property owner Kevin Lansdell to access his property it may need to be better constructed and formed to adequately service Lot 3.

Council expressed concerns in relation to the low lying nature of the land and possibility of flooding in heavy rainfall year, it was noted that the land is part of the catchment area for the Hotham River.

The Chief Executive Officer informed the meeting that the planning application has been forwarded to the Department of Environment and Conservation, along with a number of other State Government agencies, for comment, and that the WAPC has also been requested to refer the application to the Department of Water. It may be prudent for Council to wait on the comments provided by these departments prior to considering the application further.

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CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICERS RECOMMENDATION

That the Western Australian Planning Commission be advised that Council is prepared to support Planning Application 136056 subject to the following conditions:

- That an Environmental Impact study be undertaken because of the low-lying nature of the land;
- The applicant be responsible for costs to install a cross over to provide access from Bunmulling Road to service proposed Lot 2;
- The applicant be responsible for upgrading/improvements required for the Durham Road road reserve, to the satisfaction of the Shire of Cuballing, and installation of cross over to service proposed Lot 3; and
- The applicant be required to inform prospective purchasers of the requirements of Clauses 5.12.7 and 5.12.8 of Town Planning Scheme No 2, pertaining to development in Rural Residential Zoned areas, and that no outbuilding will be approved unless a single dwelling is existing on the property or is to be constructed at the same time (Clause 4.2 (c)).

COUNCIL ACTION

Moved Cr Haslam, seconded Cr Brown that Council waits on comments/submissions from the Department of Environment and Conservation and the Department of Water prior to giving due consideration to the planning application.

Background

Planning application, submitted by property surveyor A J Marsh Pty Ltd on behalf of property owner Mr K D Short, to realign boundaries and to provide battleaxe access to existing "land locked" blocks. The application does not propose to create additional Lots and/or certificates of title.

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Comment

The application was been referred to Councils Town Planning Consultant, Mr Trevor Moran, and his comments follow:

The proposed subdivision comprises 5 lots on 3 Certificate of Titles. Two lots on C/T 1754/078 (Lots 1924 and 4017) have no road access (as well as Lot 8025 C/T 1988/63). The creation of battleaxe lots will enable the disposal of lots similar in area to the prevailing lot size. If the Council were disposed to approve the proposal it would be reasonable for the proponent to be required to provide trafficable access to the newly created lots.

A condition of the subdivision should be that battleaxe legs be constructed to a trafficable standard.

The Shire of Cuballing Town Planning Scheme #2 (clause 4.2(b)) generally does not support the further breakdown or subdivision of land in the agricultural areas. The aim of this part of the Scheme is to protect the economic viability of rural zoned land through a presumption against subdivision except where such subdivision will enhance and/or promote the viability and diversity of general farming activity.

However the application does not intend to create additional lots and is proposing for minor boundary changes. Council has in the past supported planning applications where boundary realignments are proposed and no new lots created.

CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICERS RECOMMENDATION

That the Western Australian Planning Commission be advised that Council is prepared to support Planning Application 136149 subject to the following conditions:

- The battleaxe legs of proposed Lots 3 & 4 be constructed to a trafficable standard to the Satisfaction of the Shire of Cuballing; and
- A caveat to be placed on the Certificates of Title of proposed Lots 3 & 4 acknowledging that maintenance of the battleaxe road access is the responsibility of the property owner.

COUNCIL ACTION

Moved Cr Bradford, seconded Cr Newman that Planning Application 136149 not be supported.

Background

Local Government Act 1995, Section 5.42, provides Council with the power to delegate to the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) the exercise of its powers or the discharge of any duties except those referred to in section 5.43.

Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996, clauses 11, 12 & 13, refer to the payment of funds from Councils Municipal and Trust Fund accounts and details lists of accounts that are to be presented to Council adoption/authorisation.

Clause 12 of the Regulations allows this authority to be delegated to the CEO. Council's current delegation requires cheque payments to be signed by the Shire President (or a Councillor in his or her absence), a Councillor and the Chief Executive Officer.

Comment

Given that the CEO already has the authority to approve Electronic Fund Transfers (EFT) and Credit Card payments it seems that to delegate the cheque signing authority to the CEO could be a more efficient method of operation in place of the present method where cheques are being signed on a monthly basis by Councillors at the ordinary monthly meeting, especially in these times where a lot of invoices are issued with a 7 or 14 day payment period.

The Regulations (clause 13) still require a detailed list of accounts to be presented to Council for adoption. It is not proposed that the CEO be the sole signatory on cheques, it could be for example the CEO and Accountant (who works each Friday), and/or a Councillor in absence of either of these persons. This delegated authority is in operation in most local governments throughout the State and works well. The delegation will be reviewed annually when the Delegated Authority Register is reviewed and also at the time of Audit, no doubt any concerns will be raised at those times if it was suspected that something inappropriate was happening.

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A copy of Clause 11, 12 & 13 of the Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996 is circulated.

CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICERS RECOMMENDATION

For Council consideration.

COUNCIL ACTION

Moved Cr Hawksley, seconded Cr Brown. That Council amends the Register of Delegated Authority as follows:

That a minimum of two signatures are required to make payment from the Shire of Cuballing Municipal and Trust Accounts. The two required signatures shall be that of the Chief Executive Officer and Accountant, and/or a Councillor in absence of either of these persons/officers.
