

Council is currently processing a Development Application for a proposed Optus Mobile Phone tower adjacent to Springhill Road in Cuballing. This is a separate to the Telstra Mobile Phone service anticipated to commence in Cuballing by June 2017. In 2016 Optus obtained approval to construct a Mobile Phone service as part of the NBN tower in Popanyinning.



- granted conditional approval for Mr Bruce Gibson to camp for up to 8 days each month at his property at Lot 868 Shaddicks Road, East Popanyinning
- did not agree to allow two Shire of Cuballing residents to have Water Service Agreements to supply water to their properties.
   A water service agreement is where a property is connected to the Water Corporation water main on the Shire road and the water meter and a private pipe is located in the road reserve to pipe the water to a private property. Council cited risk to Council of costs from public liability and damages as reasons for this decision;
- adopted a 10 Year Road Construction Program. In 2017/18 it is expected that Council will complete \$747,600 of road construction, funded by \$570,200 in various road grants. Council will contribute \$177,400 of ratepayers funds
- adopted a 10 Year Plant Replacement Program. Plant Replacement will cost an average of \$320,000 each year. This has increased by an estimated \$10,000 per year with the decision of the State Government to charge local governments stamp duty on the purchase of vehicles.






NRM is the management of natural resources such as land, water, soils, plants and animals. It brings together land use planning, water management, biodiversity conservation and sustainability of industries such as agriculture, mining, tourism, fisheries and forestry.



#### Farmers 4 Fauna

A new partnership between Peel Harvey Catchment Council (PHCC), the Department of Parks and Wildlife and Project Numbat will focus on the recovery of numbat (Myrmecobius fasciatus) and woylie (Bettongia penicillata ogilbyi) populations within the Dryandra Woodland. The focus of the Farmers for Fauna project will be on one of the biggest threats, feral cats.

On 6th April the Threatened Species Commissioner, Gregory Andrews along with approximately 40 of Dryandra's

neighbours, Shire representatives and guest speakers from the Department of Agriculture and Food joined PHCC at Dryandra Woodland's Barna Mia Wildlife Sanctuary to launch the project. The Farmers for Fauna project is part of PHCC's commitment to support the community on key biosecurity issues across the Hotham-Williams. One interesting fact we learnt from Mr Andrews is that the numbat is twice as rare and more endangered than China's Giant Panda!



#### **Tunbridge Gully Weed Spraying**

The first round of spraying invasive weed Juncus acutus along Tunbridge Gully and the Hotham River foreshore in Boddington is complete. The project managed by Peel Harvey Catchment Council and funded through Worsley Alumina South32. South32 is focusing on weed control, rehabilitation, cross cultural knowledge, education opportunities and improving aesthetics and recreational opportunities. A second community planting day will occur during winter 2017.

#### On-Farm Weed Workshop

Local landholders joined PHCC on 11th April at the Treasure Family "Fernhill" Shearing Shed in Wandering for an onfarm weed management workshop. Agronomist, Andrew Storrie from AGNRONOMO presented information on herbicide resistance, environmental weeds affecting agriculture, factors affecting spraying, effective spray quality and the importance of water quality. A practical session included boom spray

calibration and understanding nozzle selection. Workshop participants were offered the opportunity to receive funding of up to \$1000 towards weed control



#### Partnership at Popanyinning



Feral cats in Australia have been identified as the main predator for small native mammal species and birds. PHCC, have partnered with the Shire of Cuballing and WA Feral Animal Management (WAFAM) to control feral cats at the Popanyinning Waste Disposal Site.

Funding from the Australian Government's National Landcare Programme will assist with fencing around the site, monitoring feral cat numbers as well as strategic trapping. WAFAM will also work with the Shire on feral cat management procedures and protocols and with the community on responsible cat ownership to minimise impact on the surrounding biodiversity. Popanyinning is only a few kilometres away from the Dryandra Woodland, home to the endangered numbat and woylie among other iconic native fauna.

An information session on the Popanyinning project will be held on Saturday 6th May from 3pm to 4:30 pm at the Popanyinning Town Hall.



#### **Popanyinning Anzac Day Address**

#### Notes from Stephen Bowes and read by Cr Eliza Dowling

In the years following the end of the Great War, throughout Australia, groups of citizens set about compiling lists of the men and women from their communities to have enlisted for service, with special mention for those who had given their lives. These lists became the basis for construction of memorials, from the most humble to the most grand, in towns large and small, across the length and breadth of the country. The enormity of this task, and the manner in which it was undertaken, sometimes years after 1918, mean that despite the best of intentions, Rolls of Honour contain errors and omissions. One such memorial graces the south wall of the Popanyinning Hall. And one such omission has recently come to light on the Popanyinning Roll of Honour:

Reginald John Medhurst was born in Penshurst. Kent and emigrated from England just prior to the First World War. He was one of at least seven children of Ebenezer and Georgina Medhurst. His brothers would probably have joined him Western Australia had the War not intervened. In England, Reginald was a domestic gardener. In his spare time, he played cricket and was a member of the bell ringing team at St Mary's Church,

Chiddingstone, Kent.

When he enlisted for service in August 1915, he was a farm hand, and gave his address as: care of the Post Office, Popanyinning. He took the Loyal Oath at Black Boy Hill, and his medical examination. which recorded that he was 24 years old, 5 feet 4.5 inches tall, weighed 126 pounds, and had a fresh complexion, grey eyes and light brown hair. He was Church of England.

3425 Private RJ Medhurst was appointed to the 11th Battalion in the 11th Reinforcements, which sailed Fremantle from aboard SS Ulysses (His Majesty's Australian Transport A38) on the 2nd of November, 1915.

The new recruits joined the 11th Battalion at Nabieta. in Egypt. The Battalion sailed from Alexandria for Marseilles, arriving in France on the 5<sup>th</sup> of April, 1916.

By mid-May, they were in front line trenches near Petillon, in the Fleurbaix sector. Their first action came at the Cordonniere salient, a bombardment by German artillery, followed by an attack by German infantry.

In July, they moved to the Somme, joining severe fighting around Pozieres, culminating on the 23rd of July with the capture of Pozieres.

In February of 1917, the 11th Battalion saw front Continued on pg 12



line duties near 'Yarra Bank', before they were relieved by the 9<sup>th</sup> Battalion. Around this time, it became known that the enemy had vacated its front line trenches, with the intention of straightening its line. On the evening of the 25<sup>th</sup> of February, a working party at the ammunition dump came under shell fire, in which ten men were killed and 13 wounded, one of whom was Reginald Medhurst. He was admitted to the 1<sup>st</sup> Australian General Hospital at Rouen with a gunshot wound and severe fracture to his right leg. He responded well to treatment and was "pronounced out of danger" after several weeks in hospital.

However, his recovery faltered, he deteriorated sharply and died of wounds on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of March, 1917. Reginald was buried in the St. Sever Cemetery Extension, Rouen, in Northern France.

The Australian War Memorial Roll of Honour records the service and the sacrifice of Private Reginald John Medhurst. It states his 'Place of Association' as Popanyinning, Western Australia.

Sadly, he was overlooked when the Popanyinning Roll of Honour was compiled. He was forgotten. He is no longer overlooked nor forgotten by his community, as of today, ANZAC Day 2017.

This ANZAC Day 2017, we mark the centenary of the momentous events on the other side of the world in 1917. We remember and honour those from Popanyinning who volunteered as citizen soldiers for the First AIF, and those we lost:

- John Stanislaus LACEY, 12<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Killed in Action 25/2/1917, on the Somme between Bapaume and Albert
- Reginald John MEDHURST, 11<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Died of Wounds 23/3/1917 at Rouen, France





#### **Toolibin Lake**

Toolibin Lake is an important wetland. The largest remaining fresh-brackish lake left in the Wheatbelt. It was designated as a natural diversity recovery catchment in 1996. The lake is listed as a Wetlands of International Importance under the Ramsar Convention.

The catchment features the critically endangered 'Melaleuca strobophylla-Casuarina obesa' threatened ecological community. These wooded freshwater wetlands are some of the last examples of a once-widespread vegetation type.

Many rarely seen water birds visit including the freckled duck, pinkeared duck, hard head and blue winged shoveller.

The lake is located about 45 kms east of Narrogin at the headwaters of the Northern Arthur River which joins the Blackwood River further south.

The Department of Parks and Wildlife has been guided by a recovery plan since 1994 in managing Toolibin Lake and surrounding biota.

A revised recovery plan is in development. A recovery team advises the team on implementing recovery actions.

The department has undertaken work to manage altered hydrology in the lake and surrounds, works include construction of a waterway and diversion channel to move saline water away from ecological assets; installation of groundwater pumps to reduce groundwater levels; broad-scale revegetation; and installation of gates to control flows into Toolibin Lake.

Recovery actions as well as a drying climate have successfully contributed to protecting the catchment's wildlife and avoiding catastrophic declines in the wetland vegetation.

Since the Department of Parks and Wildlife have been managing

the lake, major works have been undertaken to manage altered hydrology including the construction of a 7 km diversion channel and gates to divert highly-saline water away from Toolibin Lake; construction of a waterway to move saline surface water through the nature reserves and avoid ponding; broadscale revegetation on private property and conservation estate and installation of a groundwater pumping system to pump saline groundwater from below the lake.

SWCC (South West Catchments Council) has supported and contributed to various works throughout the catchment.

Heavy rains to the Wheatbelt area during February 2017 resulted in a fill event at Toolibin Lake; events that were once common, but since climate change are now rare.

At the event peak, 4100 megalitres filled the lake (which is 7 times the volume of Subiaco Oval/Stadium). The lake peaked at 2.0m deep and covered an area of 310 hectare.

The only other recorded event to surpass this was during the winter of 1983 when the lake peaked at 5700 megalitres (10 Subiaco Oval/Stadiums).

#### **NBN Outage**

Some areas to the east of the Popanyinning experienced an outage in their NBN wireless network connection, from Thursday/Friday the 30th of April, for up to 5 days.

As a first step, each of those persons called their internet providers to be reconnected.

In all of the cases, internet providers confirmed that their service was operating and that there were no problems with the connection.

Each person then thought that the NBN service had gone down.

A couple of people used their phones as hotspots, but had difficulty in locating a contact number for NBN on the internet.

Thanks to Gary Sherry, from the

Shire of Cuballing, who passed on the contact number for an NBN representative, I now have the correct information, from the Community Relations Officer of NBN, who contacted me on Friday, 7<sup>th</sup> April.

A connection problem was experienced on the eastern sector (called section1) and the tower was remotely restarted.


It appeared to be working again. However, as experienced by a number of people in that sector, it didn't reboot as expected.

On Wednesday, a piece of hardware on the tower was replaced, and the connection was re-established.


For an unknown reason, there were no complaints lodged by any of the service providers to the NBN team, to say that problems were being experienced in that sector of the NBN reception area.

For some users of the fixed wireless network, the reception was out from Friday 31st March until Wednesday

5<sup>th</sup> of April. NBN has expressed their concern over the lack of communication form service providers to the NBN team.

Diversion gates and a diversion channel were constructed in 1995 with the purpose of directing highly saline water away from Toolibin Lake.

As per management guidelines the water was tested on Saturday 11/2/2017 morning and deemed fresh. Department staff closed the gates allowing fresh water to flow directly into Toolibin Lake.

This fill event will bring opportunities for the department to test the infrastructure, importantly how the groundwater pumps work with fresh water sitting above the lake floor, hydrological models and undertake recovery actions

associated with waterbirds.

Planned works include waterbird, invertebrate, bat and amphibian surveys, monitoring of surface water levels and quality, and groundwater monitoring.

As well as current works which include managing the pumping system, managing the reserve and visitor facilities as an increase from visitors and the science community to the lake and reserve is expected.




