Launch of The Great War Histories of the Shire of Cuballing

On Saturday 16th February 2018 the Shire of Cuballing launched The Great War Histories of the Shire of



Cuballing book at the Cuballing Agricultural Hall in front of 60 local residents and family members.

The book, based on individual articles prepared by Popanyinning resident Stephen Bowes and included in *The Cuby News* over several years, tells the personal stories of soldiers from the First World War with links to the Shire of Cuballing who died on active service.

Shire President Mark Conley commended all involved in compiling the book, including Stephen Bowes for writing the stories, for the

Shire staff who compiled the historical documents included and the families who provided the photos.

The production of the book was assisted by grant funding from the Department of Veteran's Affairs. Copies of *The Great War Histories of the Shire of Cuballing* will be provided to libraries in the region and to local schools. Local residents can collect a book from the Shire Office.



The day started off with a short service at the Cuballing War Memorial conducted by Ries Chattilon from the Narrogin RSL. Riders from the Dryandra Pony Club attended the service in slouch hats and khaki.

Cr Tim Haslam and brothers Cecil and Don Fairhead laid wreaths in honour of the soldiers who are listed on the Popanyinning and Cuballing War Memorials. The Fairhead family farmed east of Cuballing when the Great War broke out and three brothers Cecil, Bert and Leo Fairhead, all enlisted. The youngest brother, Cecil, died on a Belgium battlefield in 1918.

PRESIDENT'S PEN

During 2018 Cuballing Shire purchased 74 Austral Street, land between Austral and Alton streets, with the intention of establishing a storage yard for the Shire on two of the 6 blocks and using the remainder to attract business to Cuballing. Over the years, we have had several conversations with business owners enquiring about establishing or expanding their businesses in Cuballing but very few have progressed, largely due to the lack of suitable land available.

It is now a matter of history that the Shire storage yard proposal did not proceed after concerns raised during public consultation. Interpreting the significance of the public concern is difficult, particularly in relation to any new business owner that may wish to purchase land from the Shire, establish a business and potentially create local employment opportunities.

In our Community Strategic Plan, which is a summary of community consultation, attracting new business is an objective clearly stated. However, I am concerned it may not be a genuine goal of our community - is this a case of "yes, but not in my back yard"?

Council debated at length but did not resolve a draft land-use plan for the 6 blocks at 74 Alton Street prior to release for public consultation. As the matter was not resolved, Councillors will revisit the issue again before the end of February and release a draft document in March. I urge everyone with an interest in growing our community, to consider and make comment on that document when released. The fundamental issue is about encouraging business to our town.

HORSE MANURE LEFT IN PUBLIC SPACES

The Shire of Cuballing has recently received a complaint about horse manure on town roads and paths. The horse manure left on roads and footpaths is an issue for other path users and nearby home owners.

While horses are able to use Shire of Cuballing roads without restriction, riders using roads and paths are encouraged to remove any manure left behind by their animals.

Currently the Shire of Cuballing does not have a local law restricting the movements of horse owners or the manure of their horses, but other local governments certainly do. Such local laws allow for fines and infringements for riders of horses who do not collect the manure from the horses.

Shire staff are investigating the possibility of such a local law for the Shire of Cuballing.

NRM is the management of natural resources such as land, water, soils, plants and animals. It brings together land use planning, water management, biodiversity conservation and sustainability of industries such as agriculture, mining, tourism, fisheries and forestry.

River Action Plans for the Hotham and Williams Rivers

As part of the Newmont Boddington Gold and PHCC partnership, River Actions Plans (RAPs) and River Health Assessments (RHAs) are being planned for the Hotham and Williams Rivers.

It is proposed that the RAPs will involve assessments of the river foreshore In approx. 6 locations across the catchment which have significant community values and will inform proposed restoration works. The RHAs will provide a snap shot of the health of the river and a baseline prior to restoration works. It is planned the RHAs are conducted again after restoration works to measure change in river health over time.

PHCC will be getting in touch with the Shires, landholders and wider community to discuss these plans in the coming months.



PHCC were pleased to support the Wandering Fox Hunt in February; 13 teams, 158 foxes, 7 feral cats, 7 rabbits and 2 feral pigs. A great effort by all involved.


