

CEMETERIES ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Shire of Cuballing is establishing a Cemeteries Advisory Committee to make recommendations to Council about the management of the two operating cemeteries at Cuballing and Popanyinning.

The Cemeteries Committee will advise Council on matters relating to the Popanyinning Cemetery, the Cuballing Cemetery, lonely and heritage graves, niche facilities, the Shire of Cuballing Cemeteries Local Law 1998 generally, including but not limited to;

- Fees and charges;
- Maintenance quality, practices and procedures;
- Infrastructure requirements;
- Design elements;
- Relevant and required Policies;
- Availability of supply; and

• Trends in cemetery management and community expectations and needs.

The Committee will promote and identify opportunities for development and enhancement of cemeteries, remembrance gardens and niche facilities.

The Committee will include one Shire Councillor and six local community members with an interest in our local cemeteries. It is expected that the Committee will meet at least twice a year.

YORNANING DAM

The Peel Harvey Catchment Council are completing a study of



Hotham River & Williams Rivers and tributaries that will inform the development of a Hotham Williams River Action Plan.

The Shire of Cuballing and the PHCC team used the opportunity of their recent Hotham River field assessments to also review the health of Yornaning Creek. The Creek feeds into Yornaning Dam, a popular picnic spot for families and bird and wildflower enthusiasts.

The results of the Yornaning Creek assessment will be communicated when they are received.

The Shire of Cuballing invites you to nominate an outstanding individual or group for one of this year's Australia Day Citizenship Awards to be presented on Australia Day, 26 January 2019.

The awards foster, recognise and celebrate significant contributions to community life and active citizenship in the Shire of Cuballing.

> The Shire of Cuballing Citizenship Awards promote National Pride, Community Responsibility and Participation.

Guidelines and Criteria

Each year a local citizen and one local community group will be eligible for the Shire of Cuballing Citizenship Awards.

The recipients will be selected from people and groups who have made a noteworthy contribution during the current year, or given outstanding service to the local community over a number of years through active involvement. Eligibility Criteria

- Nominees should reside or work principally within the Shire of Cuballing making the award.
- Awards may not be granted posthumously in recognition of recent achievements.
- A person may receive an award on more than one occasion in recognition or involvement in an alternative initiative.
- Unsuccessful nominees may be nominated in future years.
- Sitting members of State, Federal and Local Government are not eligible.
- Staff of the Shire of Cuballing are not eligible

Nomination Process

The Shire of Cuballing invites nominations for the awards from community groups and private citizens. The Shire of Cuballing may also make nominations based on local knowledge and experience

Selection Criteria

The winners will have been judged to have shown active citizenship and:

- Significant contribution to the local community
- Demonstrated leadership on a community issue resulting in the enhancement of community life.
- A significant initiative which has been brought about positive change and added value to community life
- Inspiring qualities as a role model for the community.
- The Councillors of the Shire of Cuballing will select the winners from the nominations received.
- The Shire of Cuballing Citizenship award will be presented at the Annual Shire of Cuballing Australia Day event.

Numbat Dig Workshop



Landholders surrounding Dryandra attended a Numbat Dig Workshop to learn how to identify numbat digs and scats to help to determine if numbats are moving out of Dryandra Woodland and Into patches of woodland on farms.

We were pleased to have Tamara from Project Numbat present the workshop as part of our Numbat Neighbourhood Project.

Mel and Christine used the skills they learnt at the Numbat Dig Workshop to help complete a Numbat Dig Survey the following day within the Numbat-Woylie enclosure in Dryandra.

At the end of an interesting couple of days we were lucky (and very excited) to spot a numbat on our drive out of Dryandra.

Community Environment Grants

Through funding from the Australian Government's National Landcare Program, we recently ran a community environmental grant round under our Greening Farms and Numbat Neighbourhood projects.

We had a great response from our community with a total of 42 applications being received. All applications were reviewed by a project steering committee and recommendations were made on the applications. We are pleased to advise that 35 applications were recommended for approval!

We have been busy preparing agreements for each project, which have now been sent to landholders.

Skeleton weed summer surveillance

As part of the Skeleton Weed Program, the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD) will be carrying out Random Surveillance within grain growing areas between December 2019 and March 2020.

Part of this surveillance will use unmanned aerial vehicles (UAV) to complement traditional targeted surveillance. We have scheduled UAV surveillance for the Shires of **Pingelly**, **Cuballing and Narrogin** between **19 and 30 December 2019** for non-infested properties. There are no known infested skeleton weed properties within these shires.

Inspecting paddocks

We are seeking landholder cooperation to nominate properties to undertake UAV surveillance searching if they meet the criteria:

- crop (preferable) or pasture paddocks
- minimum of 3 paddocks (150-300ha)
- paddocks to be stock-free for at least 4 weeks
- paddocks not sprayed within the last 4-6 weeks

Reporting options

We encourage all landholders in grain growing areas to search their own paddocks, and report any suspect sightings. Surveillance guidelines are available from your local DPIRD office. 
