
COVID-19 RESPONSE PLAN

The Shire of Cuballing is continuing to roll out the Shire's COVID-19 Response Plan. The Shire's Response Plan includes:

- 1. a zero net rate increase and no increase in fees and charges;
 - While the Shire of Cuballing will not increase the total amount of rates charged, the individual rate bills of some rural ratepayers may increase or decrease according to changes in their individual property valuations.
- 2. Provide rate relief packages for ratepayers of the Shire who are eligible on the following basis:
 - a. a refund of up to \$400 of 2019/20 local government rates (not ESL or waste charges) pro rata;
 - Applications are to be in writing and should demonstrate a reduction in business income or a loss of employment resulting from COVID or the measures to restrict COVID;
 - c. There is no application form. Ratepayers can apply to the Shire of Cuballing by: email at enquiries@cuballing.wa.gov.au; or mail to PO Box 13, CUBALLING WA 6311; or drop off during business hours to the Shire Office in Campbell Street, Cuballing.

- c. applications determined jointly by the Shire President and Chief Executive Officer;
- d. any approvals will be credited to then ratepayers 2020/21 year's rates;
- e. the program is limited to a pool of \$10,000;
- f. The benefit will be paid as a credit to 2020/21 years rates.
- bringing forward planned capital projects that are currently included in Council's forward planning documents by using Council's reserves to fund construction. Council would welcome comments on projects that ratepayers consider a priority;
- 4. identifying measures to rebuild the Shire of Cuballing community by:
 - a. allocating \$4,000 to a small grants process to assist local community organisations to hold events and activities in the Shire of Cuballing that bring the Shire of Cuballing community together or boost the Shire of Cuballing local economy; and
 - b. continuing to plan and fund Council's scheduled community events in the 2020/21 financial year despite the potential restrictions from social distancing.

JUNE COUNCIL MEETING

At their June 2020 Ordinary Meeting the Council:

- 1. Approved an application for advertising signage at the Cuballing Roadhouse to be constructed on Council property. The Council requires conditions to be met with the signage;
- Accepted a Financial Management Review of the Shire's operations. The Shire is required to review of the effectiveness of the financial management systems and processes at least once every three years and report these findings to the Council. This review was the first since 2016. A copy of the review can be found on the Shire of Cuballing website and in the Minutes of the Meeting;
- 3. Adopted a Long Term Financial Plan and a Corporate Business Plan. The Corporate Business Plan is Council's four year planning document, aligning to the Shire's Community Strategic Plan 2017-2027. The purpose of the Long Term Financial Plan is to guide the future direction of the Council in a financially sustainable manner. Copies of both documents can be found on the Shire of Cuballing website and in the Minutes of the Meeting;
- 4. Adopted the Shire of Cuballing's Bushfire Hazard Management Plan. This plan is part of a state-wide program to support local governments to develop and implement an integrated bushfire risk management planning framework in their local area. Prior to consideration by Council, the Plan was endorsed by the Office of Bushfire Risk Management (OBRM) on 27th May 2020 confirming that the Plan met their standards. Within six months, the Shire of Cuballing is required to finalise a Treatment Schedule for all properties within the Shire. The Shire will be able to obtain grant funding to complete works to moderate the highest risks. A copy of the Plan can be found on the Shire of Cuballing website and in the Minutes of the Meeting;
- Approved a sale process for surplus and obsolete items. Items will be sold on a mix of state-wide auction, advertised through regional newspapers and locally in the Cuby News. Some are advertised elsewhere in this newspaper.

NUMBER OF DOGS PERMITTED AT A RESIDENCE

The Shire of Cuballing Dogs Local Law permits property.

- 2 dogs if they reside within the Cuballing and Popanyinning townsites; or
- 4 dogs if they reside on a rural property.

Dog owners who wish to own an additional dog or dogs, can apply to have up to 4 dogs at their

In considering such a request, Council will seek comment from neighbours on the proposal. So far in 2020 Council has not approved any of the 3 requests to have additional dogs at a property.

All dogs in the Shire of Cuballing must be registered.

One hundred and forty eight appeared to be a very gettable score however this just was not to be the case as Towns were bowled out for


Rex Milentis, Tony Carew-Reid and Geoff Whitehorn were the only batsmen to reach double figures.

They scored 30, 18 and 20 respectively.


Todd Dowling was the best bowler for Cuballing taking 3/9 off 10 overs.
