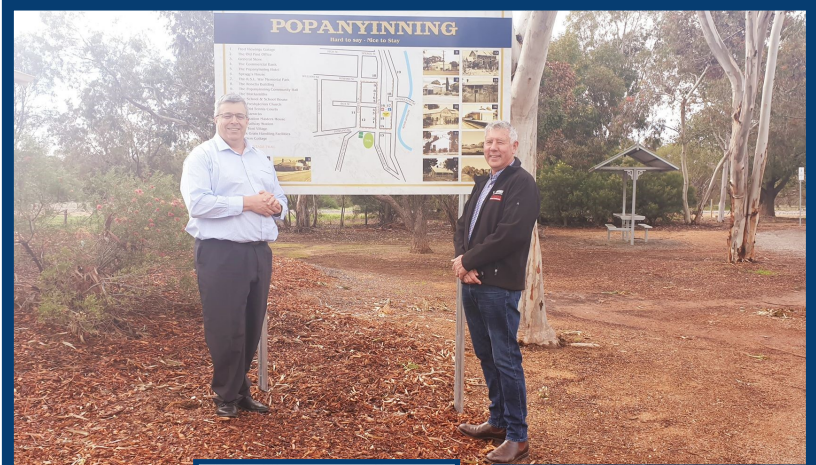
On Tuesday 28th July the Shire of Cuballing officially opened the updated Popanyinning Heritage Trail and new renovations to the Popanyinning Hall.

The Popanyinning Heritage trail consists of 19 heritage sites in Popanyinning. Some of the sites, like the school, general store and station masters house still remain. Other sites, like the CBH site, original tennis courts and fettlers' cottages, are no more.

The Heritage Walk Trail was installed by the Popanyinning Progress Association in 2008 and is an easy grade walk that takes approximately 40minutes. Popanyinning Heritage Trail brochures will be available from the Shire of Cuballing and other tourist information sites.

The Popanyinning Hall was refurbished by Cuballing Building Company. The works consisted of raising the floor in the portico to eliminate the step into the hall from the front entrance, rendering the facade, installing an accessible ramp and new sliding glass doors. The signage on the front of the portico was renovated by Shire staff.

The works to the front entrance of the Popanyinning Hall were completed as part of the Shire of Cuballing's Disability Access and Inclusion Plan. Other Shire facilities are scheduled for similar treatment in the next four years.

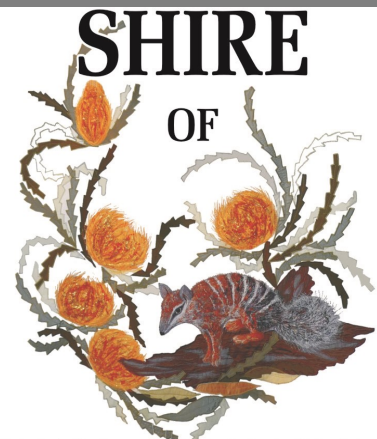

Planning for the rail reserve upgrade in the Cuballing townsite is back on the agenda after delays caused by the COVID-19. The area bounded by Campbell Street, Alton Street, Darcy Street and the Great Southern Highway sits central to Cuballing townsite but remains largely vacant. There are numerous ways to develop the area to connect our town, promote tourism, acknowledge our history, provide community facilities or simply beautify the area and we need community input to determine what this redevelopment may look like.

LOCAL EVENT AND PROJECTS (LEAP) GRANT PROGRAM

As part of the response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Shire of Cuballing has allocated funds to a grants process to assist local community organisations to hold events and activities in the Shire of Cuballing that bring the Shire of Cuballing community together or boost the Shire of Cuballing local economy. This LEAP program will be supported in future years from revenue from the private advertising in The Cuby News newsletter.

Applications for LEAP funding:

- requires a supporting contribution from the community group of 50% of the projects cost. This requirement puts an onus on the community group to commit to the project or event rather than just use funds from Council because they are available;
- requires a community group's contribution to include a cash component of at least half of the group's total contribution. An in-kind contribution by the community group, most likely volunteer labour, can be up to half of their total contribution;
- eligible projects are capital works and community events;
- that community groups can receive a maximum contribution from LEAP of \$2,000 per year. This could be from one LEAP grant or a combination of smaller grants.
- Allows Council flexibility to approve applications that Council that fit with the "Spirit" of LEAP grants.

All applications will be decided by Council.

SHIRE OF CUBALLING - RATES INCENTIVE PRIZE DRAW

The Shire of Cuballing is again conducting a Rates Incentive Prize Draw and ratepayers who pay their rates in full by the due date of 10th September 2020, will automatically be entered into the prize draw.

In previous years the Shire has conducted a similar prize draw using donated prizes from businesses located outside of the Shire of Cuballing. This year the Shire is looking to support and promote local businesses located within the Shire.

In 2020 the Shire will provide twenty \$50 vouchers as prizes for the Rates Incentive Prize Draw. Each voucher can be redeemed at businesses located within the Shire of Cuballing.

Winners will present their voucher to a local business as part of the payment for a purchase at that local business. The local business will then present the voucher to Council to be paid.

The terms and conditions of the Rates Incentive Prize Draw are available from the Shire. Shire Councillors and employees of the Shire are ineligible to win a prize.

CUBALLING FIRE STATION OPENING

The expansion of the Cuballing Fire Station has been officially opened. The \$36,300 project was funded by DFES capital grant through the Emergency Services Levy and has constructed one new bay for a fire appliance and widened an existing entrance to improve access for the Brigades fire trucks. The original doors of the Cuballing Fire Station included doors that were very narrow and made parking fire trucks difficult even for experienced drivers.

In opening the Fire Station, DFES Upper Great Southern Regional Superintendent Sven Andersen, paid tribute to the Shire of Cuballing Bush Fire Brigade volunteers. During the fire season the volunteer brigades of the Shire have attended DFES fire emergencies around Western Australia and safely completed a fuel reduction burn near to residences in the Cuballing townsite.

Shire of Cuballing CEO Mr Gary Sherry recognised the continued volunteer service of the local Fire Brigades and in particular the great work of Chief Bush Fire Control Officer Anthony Mort, who project managed the expansion of the Cuballing Fire Station.

ESL Funding

Council will receive \$38,814 in 2020/21 to cover expenses including fire fighter insurance, maintenance of the Popanyinning and Cuballing fire sheds & vehicles, protective clothing & equipment for the brigades. Council will also receive \$6,000 to purchase a high pressure cleaner and air compressor for each of the Popanyinning and Cuballing Fire Sheds.

Tunbridge Gully Planting Day

The yearly planting of Tunbridge Gully was once again conducted in June 2020. This project aims to improve the health of the vegetation with the removal of the invasive weed *Juncus acutus* (Spiny rush). Over 6,000 species have been planted this year within a 7 hectare area leading along the gully and into the Hotham River.

Thank you to all 50 volunteers from the Year 6 Boddington District High School Students, South 32 and Newmont employees, Friends of the Reserves – Boddington (Inc.) and PHCC volunteers. Everyone braved the winter conditions, muddy water ways and enjoyed planting the seedlings, all to be rewarded with a great sausage sizzle from the BDHS P&C.

Wandering Primary School Red-tailed Phascogale Project

The Wandering Primary School students have been planting to improve red-tailed phascogale habitat that is located on their school grounds.

In 2018 the students made and installed a red-tailed phascogale nest box and they are now planting thickets of sheoaks and other locally found trees and shrubs that are the preferred habitat for phascogales.

The photo right shows Christine using a nest box camera to monitor the nest box. So far, no phascogales have moved in but one has been spotted in a neighbouring garden!

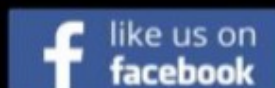

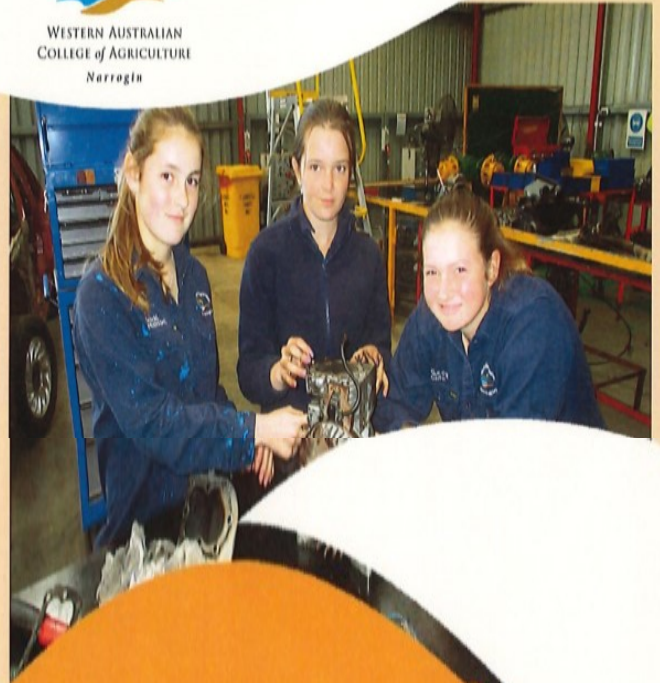
