Yornaning Dam Official Opening

The Shire of Cuballing recently held the official for the opening upgraded barbeque area and playground at the Yornaning Dam. The opening was well attended and saw attendees travel from as far as Geraldton.



Cr. Mark Conley started

the opening advising of the project to date and some history of the Yornaning Dam. Yornaning Dam has

had an important impact on the Shire of Cuballing and Narrogin by supplying domestic drinking water to Narrogin in the early years during the summer months. Up to five trains per week hauling 17,000 litres per train to Narrogin. With the advent of diesel locomotors and the Wellington Dam pipe line, the Yornaning Dam water was no longer needed for the trains.





Bill Henderson was the last pump operator in 1956. Mr Henderson's daughter, Barbara Allen, attended the opening.

Darren West MLC invited Mr Rick Wilson MP and Barbara Allen to assist with cutting the ribbon over the new boardwalk. With that the Yornaning Dam was officially opened!

Perfect weather saw attendees walk the newly cleared walk trails to find the wildflowers and orchids.




The Shire of Cuballing has received a Development Application for a bulk feed mill facility at Lots 2 and 8 (No. 429) Springhill Road, Cuballing.

The Shire of Cuballing invites you to nominate an outstanding individual or group for one of this year's Australia Day Citizenship Awards to be presented on Australia Day, 26 January 2021.

The awards foster, recognise and celebrate significant contributions to community life and active citizenship in the Shire of Cuballing.

The Shire of Cuballing Citizenship Awards promote National Pride,

Community Responsibility and Participation.

Guidelines and Criteria

Each year a local citizen and one local community group will be eligible for the Shire of Cuballing Citizenship Awards.

The recipients will be selected from people and groups who have made a noteworthy contribution during the current year, or given outstanding service to the local community over a number of years through active involvement.

Eligibility Criteria

- Nominees should reside or work principally within the Shire of Cuballing making the award.
- Awards may not be granted posthumously in recognition of recent achievements.
- A person may receive an award on more than one occasion in recognition or involvement in an alternative initiative.
- Unsuccessful nominees may be nominated in future years.
- Sitting members of State, Federal and Local Government are not eligible.
- Staff of the Shire of Cuballing are not eligible

Nomination Process

The Shire of Cuballing invites nominations for the awards from community groups and private citizens. The Shire of Cuballing may also make nominations based on local knowledge and experience

Selection Criteria

The winners will have been judged to have shown active citizenship and:

- Significant contribution to the local community
- Demonstrated leadership on a community issue resulting in the enhancement of community life.
- A significant initiative which has been brought about positive change and added value to community life
- Inspiring qualities as a role model for the community.
- The Councillors of the Shire of Cuballing will select the winners from the nominations received.
- The Shire of Cuballing Citizenship award will be presented at the Annual Shire of Cuballing Australia Day event.

BURNING PERMIT CONDITIONS

- Neighbours notified at least 24 hours prior to burning.
- Cut or rake long grass around trees, buildings and fences before burning.
- 3 people to remain in attendance at all times.
- Have water on site and a hose long enough to reach the rear of the fire.
- Burning, even with a permit, is prohibited on days that are forecast catastrophic, extreme, severe or very high fire danger.
- Fire Control Officers may impose other conditions specific to the area to be burnt.

CONGRATULATIONS DULCIE

On Monday 21st September Dulcie McGarrigal was presented with a medallion and certificate acknowledging the service by her husband Cecil McGarrigal during the Second World War.

The medallions are part of the 75th Anniversary for the end of the Second World War and the State government asked the local Members to present the certificates and medallions to the same recipients.

Dulcie is the only person listed in the State Electorate of Roe to receive this acknowledgement from Peter Rundle MP.



Michelle Hanson completed the following biography of Mr Cecil McGarrigial's war service as part of a World War II Narrogin Primary School project in 1994

WORLD WAR II

CORPORAL CECIL MCGARRIGAL

Mr Cecil McGarrigal turned eighteen on the 26th of October, 1942 and left his home town of Popanyinning to join the Royal Australian Air Force (RAAF) on the 13th of November 1942.

He was a fully trained corporal with the Number 31 Squadron RAAF Commando Signals Task Force and later joined Communications.

He did his rookies training at Busselton and experienced many days of hard training. Up to seven hours alone of each day was spent, marching around the "Bull Ring" (training ground). The training also included learning to salute properly and to use bayonets and rifles. Although training was physically demanding, you became very fit and disciplined.

In 1943, he was transferred to Darwin to do the second stage of his training. This was with the Commando Signals Task Force. The intense training that he experienced there, included how to use machine guns, hand grenades, obstacle, rope, cliff and unarmed combat training.

DULCIE MCGARRIGIAL CONTINUED

When they travelled from place to place, the sleeping conditions pretty grim. He would often sleep on the side of the road with a mosquito net, rug and excess clothes which were used for extra warmth or a pillow. There were no comforts of a mattress.

Their food was rationed and consisted mainly of tin beef (which called "Bully Beef") and hard square biscuits more commonly known to the men as "dog biscuits". They would also get the occasional treat of dehydrated potatoes and powdered eggs. The main beverages were water and black tea. As the water was not good, when it rained containers were put around the tents to collect some fresh water.

These were the conditions that the men were exposed to throughout the entire war.

After completing his training, Corporal McGarrigal left by ship not knowing his destination. He experienced his first taste of war at Morotai, as on their arrival, they had obviously been sighted and were bombed. While there, he contracted malaria arid dysentery, which has permanently affected his health. Wanting some more action, it was here that he volunteered to go in with the Army and set up communications. This had many risks involved.

One good memory of Morotai, was the time he attended a Gracie Fields concert with some other 8,000 service men, mostly Americans.

After Morotai, he continued on to Labuan, Tarakan, Borneo and the Philippines.

When peace was declared in 1945, Mr McGarrigal went back to Darwin, on to Perth and home to Popanyinning.

There were no celebrations on his arrival home to Australia. He was only 21 and found it very hard to fit back into a normal life once again.

Although he was very eager to join and serve his country in World War II, he felt that three years of his life were wasted.

I found Mr McGarrigal a very interesting person to discuss World War II with. He was able to describe the war in great detail and has some wonderful memorabilia, such as two Japanese Flags and money, a mosquito net and American clothing, to name just a few, which he showed me.

Researching this assignment was a great learning experience I learned a lot about World War II.

It was great to have Kate Barr back with the Hotham-Williams team recently to show Kristy Gregory the Williams River sites earmarked for potential on-ground projects as part of the Hotham-Williams River Action

Lovely sites like this one near Williams are already used by the community. The potential to restore the banks, control the weeds and re-introduce native species will be realised through future potential projects.

Rivers hold such an important place in our landscape and in our history, and through the restoration of habitat the PHCC wants to facilitate a renewed connection of people to the Rivers. Through the planning of potential projects, our aim will be to create areas that are ecologically restored as well as being easily accessible to the public. This will have the threefold result of environmental restoration, demonstration of healthy

ecosystems and a genuine connection of people to natural areas, whether it be in their 'backyard', a destination, or a stop-off on a long-drive!

Note: PHCC is in the process of applying for funding for future on-ground community projects across the Hotham-Williams sub-catchment.

Cape Tulip...pretty flower or toxic weed?



Cape tulip (Moraea flaccida & Moraea miniata) originates from South Africa and was introduced to Australia as a garden plant and is now widespread in the south west of Western Australia and other states.

One leaf and two leaf Cape tulips are serious weeds of pasture. The branched flowering stem has short lived pink to orange flowers which occur in late winter and spring. Animals will selectively graze clovers and other more palatable species, and this allows Cape tulips to flourish. The plants contain toxic chemicals called glycosides which affect the heart and most deaths occur in hungry animals that have recently been introduced.

When choosing plants for your garden, avoid buying species that are toxic and/or have weed potential.

Grant Updates..

- The Hotham-Williams team has been out and about visiting the completed Numbat Neighbourhood 2019/20 Community Environment Grant Projects and checking out all the seedlings that have been planted. For example, a Cuballing farmer has completed fencing and revegetation to increase habitat for threatened species and create a linkage to the East Yornaning Nature Reserve.
- The Numbat Neighbourhood, Black Cockatoo, Greening Farms and Banksia Woodland (Swan Coastal Plain area only) 2020/21 Community Environment Grant (CEG) applications were assessed across three different steering committee meetings during the week of 14th September.

The CEG program is a competitive grants process, and each application is assessed on its merits against criteria to meet Australian Government outcomes, for access to a limited pool of funds.

There were 45 applications in total across the Peel-Harvey catchment with 22 of these being for projects within the Hotham-Williams sub-catchment.

Applicants will soon be notified if their project has been successful.


