Good job team!






# AGED PERSONS INDEPENDENT LIVING UNITS

#### SPRING HILL ROAD INTERSECTION REALIGNMENT

After two years of construction the Shire of Cuballing's major realignment of the Wandering Narrogin Road has reached the final stages. On Friday 25<sup>th</sup> June the Main Roads WA line marking contractor completed the white lines on the new road.

The realigned road was part funded by the Western Australian government's Blackspot program, with the project costing \$1,057,000 over the two year construction period.

The project was completed as a two stage project. In the first year the land was resumed with culverts and base



earth works installed. In year two the road was built to level, the intersections with Nebrikinning and Springhill Roads were constructed and the final seal provided.

The size and scale of this construction project was challenging for Shire staff. The project completion was also delayed when poor draining soil needed to be excavated to achieve the required compaction levels.

The students asked great questions and listened beautifully to Jock, Jo and Christine.

#### POPANYINNING TAVERN — Our History

July 9<sup>th</sup> 2021 will mark 43 years since the Popanyinning Tavern burnt down in a blaze of glory. The Pingelly Volunteer Fire Brigade who attended the blaze are said to say, "as we came round the corner approx. 5 miles from Popo you could see the glow of the fire, we knew there was no saving her".

The stories stay the same as more and more people remember "it was the life of the town" and it is such a shame it was never rebuilt.

What would Popanyinning be like now if it was still there? There are not many towns across Australia that have a stature like Popanyinning and have no watering hole!

Two reunions have been help since that fateful day. One in July 1988 which saw over 160 ex patrons and owners attend and another on the 7th July 2018—40 years after she burnt down. Many crammed into the Popanyinning Hall on this day, happy to share stories and walk down memory lane looking over the massive heritage display.

This taken from the 1988 July reunion — One Popo resident, a stickler for the temperance cause, used to watch the hotel and ring the police if it stayed open after hours. Old-timers also recalled a failed police drug raid on a scorching summer Sunday. Although there to uphold the law, the police demanded the hotel open illegally to serve them, according to past patrons.

The former publicans had stories to tell too. "I never used to trade after hours", said Bob Brady with a wink. "A lot of business was done at the Popo pub" -Laurie Curtis. "It used to be called the 'Popo club'. "The little school even used to get its lunches there". "I was a part-time masseur and used to make a bit on the side fixing up the shearers' backs" — Ivan Martinovich. Laurie Curtis said he brought, Dr Horner, the chiropractor, to the area.

The Popanyinning Tavern started building in September of 1905 costing £2,000. The Tavern had 15 rooms and was made from stone and bricks that were sourced from local material found near the Hotham River. The Tavern was finished in early 1906 and to mark the occasion a successful grand dance and concert were held on April 2nd 1906. Mr Parker, the Tavern's owner, was described as a farmer and a widower, also became secretary of the Popanyinning Progress Association.

From 1906 to July 1978 the pub had many owners, some colourful! Some hard working, some saw it hard during the depression others hit the big time when Main Roads employed 500 unemployed

men to build the Great Southern Highway. It was all done via pick and shovel back then. You can image the thirst they had.

Recently this photo was donated to the Shire of Cuballing by Robert Dale. The photo was taken he thinks in 1954. It shows a different angle to the Tavern. Most of the images on hand are a front view so it is interesting to see an image looking south. You can also she the Popanyinning General store in the distance.




