

WHO LET THE DOG'S OUT?

It may be a fun song, but it has not been so funny in Cuballing. There have been a spate of dog attacks in Cuballing over the last few weeks which has resulted in the horrific death and dismemberment of sheep, including pets. Unfortunately, despite the efforts of Shire staff and Rangers from the Shire of Narrogin we have not been able to conclusively identify the dogs responsible. Dog owners should be aware that the gloves are off.

Severe Penalties

Under the Dog Act 1976 there are severe penalties for dog attacks including fines of up to \$10,000. If a dog attack results in death, the owner can be charged with manslaughter. If a dog kills or injures livestock the owner can be the subject of civil action by the owner of the livestock. The dog may be lawfully shot if attacking livestock.

There are also significant penalties for other offenses – these are a few:

Unregistered dog	\$200
Dog in place without consent	\$200
Dog off leash	\$200.

What is a dog attack?

The Dog Act 1976 interprets an "attack" to be

 aggressively rushing at or harassing any person or animal; or



- biting, or otherwise causing physical injury to, a person or animal; or
- tearing clothing on, or otherwise causing damage to the property of, the person attacked; or
- attempting to attack, or behaving in such a manner toward a person as would cause a reasonable person to fear injury.

Controlling Dogs

As a dog owner, you are legally responsible for how your dog behaves. By managing your dog correctly, you can prevent it from attacking people and animals:

- Never allow your dog to wander unsupervised
- Install secure fencing and regularly check it
- When out keep your dog on a leash.

When in any public place in WA, your dog must be tethered or on a leash except in designated dog exercise areas. You are still fully responsible for the control and behaviour of your dog.

Keep your dog and family safe. Allowing your dog to wander puts its health at risk and can even endanger yours. Every year hundreds of pets are shot, poisoned and impounded for attacking people and livestock. Other roaming dogs die from snake bite or traffic accidents.

Be a responsible dog owner. Dogs need more than food and water; they have to be trained, controlled, vaccinated, registered and exercised. If your dog is found wandering you will be fined or prosecuted.

If you see a dog wandering, please let the Shire know. Take a photograph if possible.



NRM is the management of natural resources such as land, water, soils, plants and animals. It brings together land use planning, water management, biodiversity conservation and sustainability of industries such as agriculture, mining, tourism, fisheries and forestry.

Koompkinning Gathering

Recently we had a catch up at Koompkinning Pumphreys Bridge to say thank you to Wilman Elder Travis (Jock) Abraham and family for their support throughout the Numbat Neighbourhood Project.

It was a lovely day where we shared lunch, yarned around the fire and planted grass trees at this important cultural site. We will continue to work with the Wilman people and other project partners, through the Hotham-Williams River Restoration projects. Over coming years, we aim to restore the environment at Koompkinning by controlling weeds and allowing the native species to regenerate, as well as planting seedlings. Rehabilitation will include bank stabilisation on the Hotham River and access points for the community.

PHCC would like to thank Travis Abraham and the Wilman people for their involvement and guidance throughout the Numbat Neighbourhood Project. We look forward to working together into the future. Yellow is for threatened flora

You may have seen these rather cryptic signs on roadsides, which look like upside down yellow hockey sticks! They serve the noble purpose of providing markers where threatened flora species are located, many of which in WA occur along road verges. Threatened Flora, also known as Declared Rare Flora (DRF), are native plant species that are at risk due to small numbers of mature plants and occurrences at a limited number of locations.

Yellow hockey sticks have just been installed at the Camballing Reserve with the assistance of the Shire of Boddington. They are there to mark the *Gastrolobium* sp. Prostrate Boddington. Most of you know Gastrolobium plants as 'egg and bacon', and there are in fact many species in that Genus of plants. This one is quite special, recorded only in the Shire of Boddington and forming large mats of green, flecked with golden flowers in spring (pictured).

Awareness of threatened and priority flora through placement of signage aims to provide buffers to native plants to prevent incidental damage from activities carried out for roadrelated services and maintenance. This activity is supported by a State NRM funded project.
