
It is hard to believe we are looking at the end of the year already. Where did 2023 go?





COUNCIL SHORTS

Council Meeting Dates for 2024

Council is required to advertise its meeting dates at least once per year. The 2024 dates are advertised in this edition of the Cuby News.

meets on the third Wednesday of each month except January. Please note the later start time of 3 pm. Also note that the venue will be the CWA Hall for every month except May, where the meeting will be in the Popanyinning Hall. Council decided that it does not require a dedicated meeting place and the current Council chambers could be better utilised for other purposes.

Planning Reform

The State Government has proposed a number of changes to planning rules with the intention of streamlining planning processes and making them more consistent.

The first of the proposed changes is mandating that all single house and related developments be processed by the CEO or planning staff under delegated authority. The theory is that it will speed up processes as there will be no need to wait for a Council meeting. In practice there will be notable difference as Council has already delegated these functions to the CEO.

The second change is, or package of changes introduce a new set of planning codes which will have the effect of including additional planning rules in Local Planning Schemes. There will be related changes:

Setting up the legislative mechanism that allows new codes to be developed;

Modifying State Planning Policies to make them less procedural – process activities will be included in new codes;

Changes to the regulations to allow codes to be imported into Local Planning Schemes.

Residential Design Codes and deemed provisions in Local Planning Schemes have been around for a number of years. This will expand the range of things set by State Government rather than the shire.

Delegate for Tourism Committee

The local tourism body closed down several months ago and passed on all of its resources to the Shire of Narrogin, which has taken over the tourism functions and the management of volunteers. Narrogin has recently opened its new visitor centre at the old railway station. The At the request of the Shire of Narrogin Cr Kowald has been nominated as the Cuballing delegate to the Narrogin and Dryandra Visitor Centre Reference group.

Numbat Country – The story of the Shire of Cuballing from the earliest days until 1997

Many people will be familiar the Cuballing history book *Numbat Country – The story of the Shire of Cuballing from the earliest days until 1997*. The book has been out of [print for several years and the Shire receives numerous requests for copies every year. We have been unable to reprint as the original galley proofs are lost.

Through a collaboration between the Shire and the Curtin University library we have been able to obtain a high-quality digital scan of the original print. This has been sufficient to arrange a reprint which is now available.

Council has set a cost recovery charge of \$30 per book including GST. Copies are available from the Shire administration.

NRM is the management of natural resources such as land, water, soils, plants and animals. It brings together land use planning, water management, biodiversity conservation and sustainability of industries such as agriculture, mining, tourism, fisheries and forestry.



Targeted weeding to support native seedlings

PHCC staff, Kristy and Victoria were joined by Newmont volunteers, Jordan and Paul at Williams River which is one of eight River Action Plan (RAP) sites in the Hotham-Williams subcatchment

The day's task was to locate and remove rye grass and other invasive species the manual way! This site has already undergone revegetation efforts in addition to carefully targeted weed spraying throughout the year. A select few areas of riparian vegetation had been left untouched from herbicide application to protect the native couch (*Sporobolus virginicus*) growing naturally, and the native seedlings planted in July. Capturing the precise moment before the rye grass had set seed, we manually removed it from these areas to minimise future spread. Sometimes a little extra effort (from the care taken by our weed control contractor and our weed-pulling volunteers) can go a long way in allowing native species to prosper and grow.

To water or not?


There are advocates of not watering at all when it comes to revegetation with native species. A proportion of seedlings will always be lost during the first summer (some sites more than others) and those can be replaced on an annual basis to gradually revegetate an area. Others might choose to water seedlings only a few times over the first summer when temperatures are forecast to push 40 degrees for several days. We chose to water some of the seedlings at the Williams RAP site during the weeding effort for a number of reasons including the current heat wave, highly compacted (and struc-



Pingelly-Cuballing line upgrade starting soon

A \$3 million package of work in the Shires of Pingelly and Cuballing to improve power reliability and the safety of the network to re-commence in November. The total work includes replacement of 230 poles, 27km of overhead lines, along with other essential network maintenance activities. This will be focussed on the main line between Cuballing and Popanyinning.



85% of total poles and 30% of lines were replaced in March, April earlier this year. Stage two work is planned from mid November to mid December 2023. This upgrade will help strengthen network resilience against seasonal and environmental impacts and enhancing safety.

Timeframe

Stage 1: March to April 2023 (completed). Stage 2: Mid November to mid December 2023.

Planned outages

It's important to know that we need to schedule power outages to do the work safely. To minimise the impact on the community, we're deploying a temporary large-scale generator to support homes and businesses in the area as we complete this essential work.

Residents of Pingelly, East Pingelly, West Pingelly, Brookton, Popanyinning, Yornarning, and Cuballing may receive some short outages, one in the morning and one in the evening (up to 30 minutes) while the generator is connected and disconnected.

A small number of customers may experience longer outages when work is happening on their part of the network. Affected customers will be directly notified about outage dates and times.




