Register as a Litter Reporter

When you register with the Keep Australia Beautiful Council Litter Report Scheme you are helping us deter people from littering our beautiful state.

About litter reports

When reporting littering it is very important to collect the following information:

- Vehicle registration
- Make, model and colour of the vehicle
- Date, time and place that the littering occurred
- Type of litter that was deposited
- Description of the offender



Person who littered (the driver or a passenger).

When KABC receives your litter report, authorised officers will investigate the complaint and take the appropriate action. An infringement of up to \$500 may be issued for individuals or up to \$2,000 for companies.

The registered owner of the vehicle is considered to have committed the offence unless they can give the name of any person authorised by the registered owner to use the vehicle at that time.

The driver is also responsible for their passengers in relation to this offence unless they can give the name and contact details of the passenger concerned.

COUNCIL SHORTS

Financials.

As always Council considered the year-to-date financial position and the payments made during the previous month.

Long Term Financial Management Plan

Following a workshop last month with Senior Staff and our Financial Management Consultant, Council has adopted a its Long-Term Financial Plan. This is one of a suite of documents that make up the Integrated Planning and Reporting for local governments in WA. This plan allows Council to project likely income and expenditure over the next 10 years and achieve the goals set out in the Strategic Community Plan.

Asset Management Plan

The Asset Management Plan adopted by Council is one of the suite of documents that make up the Integrated Planning and Reporting Framework. A significant portion of the Shire's work is asset management. This includes maintaining and replacing roads, drainage, footpaths, public buildings, sport and recreation facilities, playgrounds, and parks and gardens. Then of course it is necessary to maintain and replace the fleet of vehicles and equipment necessary to deliver that task. The asset management task is the biggest single component in the Long-Term Financial Plan,

Plant Replacement Program

The Shire plans its fleet, plant and equipment needs on a 10-year planning period. Because there are some very expensive pieces of equipment, like graders and loaders, we do our best to ensure that these replacements are planned for. We do this by maintaining a plant replacement reserve. This allows our contribution to plant replacement to remain consistent over the life of the plan. Council adopted the plant replacement program at the June meeting. This is updated annually, and a new plan adopted each year.

Delegations Register

While Council sets the strategy and direction for Council and oversees the operations, most of the day-to-day decisions are made under delegated authority by the CEO and other staff. At least once each year these delegations must be reviewed, and Council completed this review at the June Council meeting. This review was a little different in that the State Government has mandated that some planning decisions in relation to single houses may only be taken by Local Government staff and will no longer be considered a delegation by Council.

Piggery Expansion

Cuballing Pork was granted planning approval for an increase in the number of pigs that may be kept at its operations in Wardering.

Unallocated Crown Land on the Hotham River

Council was asked by the State Government to consider amalgamating a number of small parcels of crown land into existing Shire Reserves along the Hotham River in Popanyinning. This move will help facilitate river restoration work by the Peel Harvey Catchment Council. While Council was concerned at the additional responsibility with no additional funding it agreed because of the alignment of this project work with the Strategic Community Plan.

CEO Recruitment

After its normal business Council worked through the applications received for a replacement CEO and established a shortlist, with interviews scheduled for 26 June 2024. More information will become available when Council comes to an agreement with the preferred candidate.

SHIRE OF CUBALLING RECEIVES FUNDING TO REDUCE BUSH FIRE RISK

The Shire of Cuballing has been allocated \$182,400 by the State Government to undertake fire mitigation activities on State land managed by the Shire.

The funded activities include:

- Mulching of vegetation adjacent to 12 timber road bridges at various locations in the Shire of Cuballing;
- Reducing fuel loads on a number of road reserves and a Shire reserve through forestry mulching process
- Establishing fire breaks or fire access tracks in the Cuballing townsite

In all 22 discreet activities have been funded.

“These works will allow us to reduce the fire danger in Cuballing as was promised at the community meeting in February.” CEO Stan Scott said. “We will also be able to better protect important shire assets like the timber road bridges.”

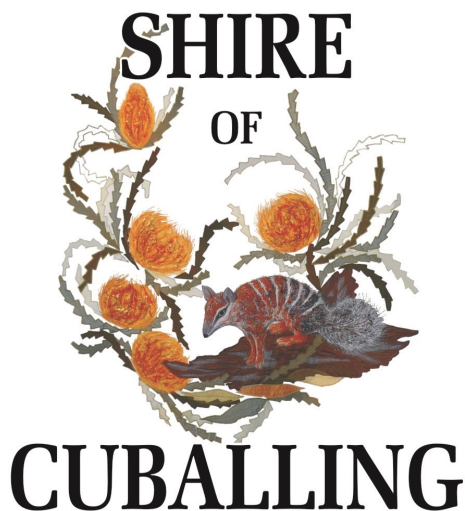
The CEO also acknowledged the efforts of Shire staff in preparing the Bush Fire Risk Management Plan which was an essential prerequisite for receiving funding, and the complex grant application including individual cost estimates for each of the funded activities. “We also want to acknowledge the assistance provided by the Pingelly Community Emergency Services Manager. He has a very large patch to deal with that does not include Cuballing. Cooperation between Shires is always appreciated.

Cuballing’s grant was part of the \$4 million from the Mitigation Action Fund Grant Program allocated by the State Government to 27 Local Governments across WA.

NRM is the management of natural resources such as land, water, soils, plants and animals. It brings together land use planning, water management, biodiversity conservation and sustainability of industries such as agriculture, mining, tourism, fisheries and forestry.



Defending Dryandra Work Commences

On ground activities have commenced for the Defending Dryandra – Feral Hotspots Project including feral cat control and camera monitoring on properties near Dryandra Woodland National Park. One of the feral cats that has been culled was a massive 7.1kg. This feral cat would have eaten hundreds of native fauna over its lifetime.

Multiple monitoring cameras have been set on the properties and results from these cameras will determine where we set up the 4G monitoring cameras. The 4G cameras will then send a notification to the pest animal control contractor when fauna is sighted allowing for more targeted feral cat control.

A big thank you to all of the landholders involved in the Defending Dryandra Project.

Hotham-Williams sub-catchment update



New Tricks at Pumphreys Bridge

PHCC tried something new at the Pumphreys Bridge project site on the Hotham River in June by planting mature trees within this year's revegetation area. The large boulders placed along the river between the public camping & picnic area has provided an ideal space for revegetation. By including mature trees, they will be visible straight away and visitors to the site will see and understand what we are trying to achieve, which is creating habitat and shade for both animals and humans!

For revegetation efforts in natural areas, PHCC usually focuses on small tubestock-sized seedlings, which are much more cost effective and tend to survive better when planted in-situ. We need to give the mature trees a lot more attention to improve their chances of survival and we did this by digging deep holes, adding an organic soil amendment, and placing 'water savers' and mulch around each sapling.

Tubestock seedlings were also planted along the top of the bank to begin the process of replacing weeds with local sedges and other low-growing species, including saltbush to assist with any potential erosion. The overall intention is to create a buffer of vegetation that eventually provides shade and ground cover but does not block the view of the river or prevent people from walking through.

Thank you to the Shire of Wandering for supplying a bobcat, auger and operator!

The Wilman (Dryandra) People Corporation continue to partner with us, and in this case they nominated Heritage Monitors to be present due to the soil disturbance and particularly deep holes where it was possible that artefacts and other archaeological materials could be unearthed and their cultural knowledge and expertise was a necessary and welcome part of the planting effort.

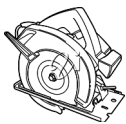
