

COUNCIL SHORTS

Ordinary Council Meetings held 16 April and 21 May 2025

<u>Draft Local Heritage Survey and Heritage List</u>

Council endorsed the draft Local Heritage Survey for public consultation in accordance with the Guidelines for Local Heritage Surveys 2022, along with the draft Heritage List as updated for public consultation in accordance with the Planning and Development (Local Planning Scheme) Regulations 2015.

Draft Shire of Cuballing Disability Access and Inclusion Plan 2025-2030

Council approved the draft Disability Access and Inclusion Plan for the period 2025-2030 as the basis for inviting general public and stakeholder comment/submissions and requested a further report that considers any submissions received prior to the June Ordinary Council Meeting in order to endorse and adopt the finalised DAIP.

Audit, Risk and Improvement Committee & Independent Membership

In line with the requirements of Division A1 section 7.1A of the *Local Government Amendment Act* 2024, all local governments need to establish a committee of its council under section 5.8 of 'the Act' to be called the "Audit Risk and Improvement Committee" (ARIC), which was previously known as the Audit committee under previous legislation. Council agreed to retitle the existing Audit Committee and authorised the CEO to initiate the recruitment process for Independent Presiding and Deputy Presiding Members for the Shire of Cuballing ARIC.

Appointment of Fire Control Officers 2025-26

Council approved the recommendations from the Bush Fire Advisory Committee meeting held on Thursday 10th April 2025 regarding the appointment of Fire Control Officers for the 2025-26 bush fire season.

Councillor Attendance Fees, Allowances and Expenses for 2025/26

The Local Government Act 1995 (the Act) section 5.98 and Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996 provide for Councillors to receive certain sitting fees, allowances and reimbursements. These payments are required to be within a range set by the WA Salaries and Allowances Tribunal.

The Council determined that the Councillor Fees, Allowances and Expenses to be paid in the 2025/26 financial year be as follows:

- Shire President meeting fee of \$270 per Council meeting
- Councillor meeting fee of \$185 per Council meeting
- Shire President's annual allowance of \$10,765
- Deputy Shire President's annual allowance of \$2,691.25
- Committee meeting fee of \$70 per meeting or other form of prescribed meeting
- Annual ICT allowance of \$500 per Councillor
- All travel and childcare costs reimbursable on presentation of proof of expense/

PRESIDENTS PEN

The good news this month is that Cuballing will be getting a CESM, or Community Emergency Services Manager, to be shared between Cuballing, Narrogin and West Arthur. Cuballing has long been advocating to have a CESM position in our area and has put in several applications that have been rejected, so we were pleased to hear from the Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES) that our latest one had been approved. The CESM will be based in Narrogin but spent at least a day a week in Cuballing, training volunteer fire fighters, assisting and supporting our local fire brigades and developing emergency management plans alongside the Shire. The position is joint funded by DFES.

We have also had some interest for a community bus service, using the 21 seat Toyota Coaster bus that was kindly donated to the Shire by Hillcroft Farms last year. This bus service would be run by the community so that our aged residents or those without a driving licence can do a weekly shopping trip to Narrogin. Given that over half our residents are over the age of 55, this is a great initiative and one Council is pleased to support. There is a bit to sort out logistically, but hopefully the bus will be up and running in the next few months.

The Cuby Winter Ball is coming up on the 14th June. The ball was brought forward to fit in with our local sporting fixtures and to catch our locals before they head north for warmer climes. In the past, the ball has been a great mix of all ages from our community and we want that to continue – which is hard if the younger sporting crew aren't able to come along and our older residents have joined the grey nomads. Tickets are still available and any volunteer help would be much appreciated.

In accordance with the Shire's Local Planning Strategy, Local Planning Scheme No. 2, and the *Planning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations 2015* a proposal for a land use that does not align with a land use class in the Scheme is required to be referred to adjoining landowners and a public notice published. This proposal is made available for inspection in order to provide an opportunity for public comment as part of the Shire's assessment process of the proposal.

Hillcroft Farms Solar Farm Application

Attached is the proposal for a Solar Farm to be built at 1395 Yornaning Road.

The solar farm will be located on Lot 7740 with the power lines crossing under Yornaning road and hooking into the transformers on Lot 13054.

Details.

600 kw approx. 1400 solar panels.

The entire solar panel project will cover approximately 1 ha.

The panels are fixed to steel posts and racking and cemented into the ground. They are fixed panels and do not oscillate tracking the sun. Layout/depth of post etc will all be engineered to spec.

A chain mesh security fence will surround it to keep animals out and satisfy any of the requirements.

Firebreaks and access roads will be inside the compound for safety.

Two access gates are in the compound as exit points in case of an emergency.

Weeds and fuel load will be controlled under panels by either grazing or spraying.

The project will be set back at least 30m from the fence line. (depending on planning regulations).

An easement is sought to enable the low voltage power lines to go under the road as shown in attached drawings.

Power lines then run to the existing transformers where it's plugged into the system after the power meter.

The project will be installed by Great Southern Electrical Services who have previously done solar farms for Gilmac Hay at Wagin and also Simon Harding at Williams.

Why variation sought to planning standard.

We are seeking variation to the planning scheme so a solar farm can be built to supply power to our existing feed mill and piggery on our property. None of this power will go back into the grid for export. This proposal is to help reduce the power costs of the feed mill and piggery.

This is all part of the renewable power push by all levels of government in trying to limit climate change and reduce the carbon footprint on the environment.

We are trying to do our bit but are also under pressure by the consumer to use more renewable power. It will be one of many renewable power projects to be built in the future.

The small solar farm will have little impact on the amenity of the area as there are already numerous pig sheds adjacent and there are no neighbouring residences within 2 kilometres.

We could have done the easy option and installed the panels on the roofs of the shed. This would not need planning approval. However, we were concerned about our OH&S responsibilities of having staff on rooftops cleaning panels. It would also prove problematic when replacing shed roofs as needed.

This whole project has been assisted by Coles who have given a grant of \$500000 to help small businesses become more efficient and improve their environmental credentials.

NRM is the management of natural resources such as land, water, soils, plants and animals. It brings together land use planning, water management, biodiversity conservation and sustainability of industries such as agriculture, mining, tourism, fisheries and forestry.



Native Animals Caught on Camera

The Defending Dryandra Cameras are not just monitoring for feral cat activity but also provide an insight into the native fauna that can be found on farms that surround Dryandra Woodland National Park. Fauna captured on camera so far include a numbat, chuditch, brush -tailed possums, echidna, kangaroos, guenda and bush-stone curlew.

These 4G cameras have been essential for providing





real-time monitoring of feral cats enabling our pest animal control contractor to plan the control efforts they undertake. Since August 2024 40 feral cats and 22 foxes have been culled on the 3 properties involved in the project. This control is helping to reduce threats to Dryandra's fauna.

This Defending Dryandra - Feral Hotspots Project is supported by funding from the State Government's Feral Cat Management Grants.





New Horizons - Soil testing for efficient fertiliser application

The Healthy Estuaries WA project is a program that has been running on the Swan Coastal Plain area since 2020, aimed at reducing nutrient runoff into the water that feeds into the Peel-Harvey Estuary. We are now able to offer a variation of this program to parts of the upper catchment on grazing pastures or hay through New Horizons.

New Horizons aims to promote best practice, evidence-based fertiliser decisions in high rainfall pastures. Supporting farm profitability and reducing environmental risk.


Producers who fall within the >550ml rainfall zone (see map attached for eligible zone), who commit to the program with a \$300 contribution to the soil analysis, will receive detailed analysis with comprehensive paddock by paddock whole farm nutrient mapping of the results. This will provide accurate data on what levels of soil amendments are needed, helping producers manage the paddock and spend their dollars and their products more efficiently.

You will be provided training to take representative soils samples with equipment that can be loaned or purchased. You will be invited to attend the "Grow Your Profits" event to interpret your results and learn more about key macronutrients, along with

a number of other opportunities such as an Accuspread field day and various soil health workshops.

Landcare matters

Hotham-Williams sub-catchment update



Weedy Wattles

The yellow wattle flower coupled with green-hued leaves is iconically Australian. But not all wattles are equal when it comes to where they are growing!

These photos are taken near the Hotham River in Boddington and are of *Acacia iteaphylla* 'Flinder's Range wattle' and *Acacia decurrens* 'black wattle', both of which belong in Eastern Australia. *Acacia longifolia* or 'Sydney golden wattle' is another common species. In WA, these wattles tend to seed prolifically, and are considered a weed due to their ability to colonise an area to the detriment of local species.

These **non-native** wattles are also short lived and can pose a significant fire hazard when they start to naturally senesce. The trick is to get rid of large **non-native** specimens when you come across them, which may involve chainsaws and mulching. Make sure it is before flowers and fruit develop, usually during the second half of the year. When the wattles are small, they can easily be hand-pulled, and it is important to stay on top of them when they are in the small stages of growth.

Acacia iteaphylla 'Flinder's Range wattle'

Black wattles in particular can get very large, and when cut down, they can be used for firewood.

We have some lovely WA wattles species, including *Acacia saligna* and *Acacia pulchella*, and these are excellent to use in revegetation projects. Check out other WA local wattles on the Florabase website by typing 'Acacia' into the Search Names field at the top of the home page. There is a whole list you can look through including photos and descriptions, by clicking on the leaf icon next to each species name.




