Council and staff have been working hard to deliver a robust budget for 2025/26 for the Shire and that will come out this month. The Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Network on the Cuballing East Road has been a major project for the Shire in the last few years and has taken up much of the Shire's resources in terms of plant and labour. It has also provided a large amount of revenue which has enabled us to build up our road building capability and upskill our staff. Whilst this project will carry on, the Shire will be putting more of a focus on maintaining our existing assets i.e. more time and money spent on the rest of our roads including cleaning out and restoring culverts etc in the coming 12 months.

Council elections are looming (October 2025) with nominations for councillors due in next month. COUNCIL SHORTS

With the State and Federal elections now complete, the next election on the horizon will be for all Local Governments in WA, and thus the Shire of Cuballing, to be held on Saturday 18 October 2025.

The Council of the Shire of Cuballing comprises 6 elected members, and three of these positions will be vacant for the election. Nominations for Councillor candidates will open on Thursday 28 August 2025 and close a week later at 4pm Thursday 4 September 2025.

Our Councillors play an important leadership role within our community, and becoming a member of Council is one way you can ensure community perspectives are heard and considered in local decision making.

Undertaking the role of a Council member is a big personal commitment. The Department of Local Government, Industry Regulation & Safety (DLGIRS) has developed an induction course to assist your understanding of what the obligations and commitments will be if you are elected. It is compulsory to complete this induction before you nominate, and it will take approximately 30 minutes to complete. At the end of the induction, you must complete the online registration to receive an official confirmation from the Department and it is strongly recommended that this digital or email copy accompany your candidate nomination form. It is an offence to make false or misleading statements in the nomination form, and penalties may apply.

As the 2025/2026 Rates soon approach, it is important to ensure that you have correct and up to date personal details. Please ensure, that if you have changed your postal address, email address, etc, that you notify the Shire of Cuballing either in person or via email.

If you have obtained a new concession card in 2024/2025, you will be eligible for a concession on your Rates for 2025/2026. You will need to complete an application form along with provide a copy of your concession card.

2025 Local Government Elections



Local government elections in Western Australia will take place on Saturday 18 October 2025. This year the Shire of Cuballing will be conducting an in-person election.

Key dates

Enrolment - Check, update or enrol to vote by 5pm Friday 22 August 2025

Nominations Open - Thursday 28 August 2025

Close of nominations - 4pm Thursday 4 September 2025

Election day – Saturday 18 October 2025; vote in person on election day at the designated polling place, vote early or apply for a postal vote from the Shire Administration Office.

Enrol to vote

All eligible electors must enrol to vote. When you enrol to vote, you are enrolled for Commonwealth, State and local government elections. You can check your enrolment online.

This is important if you have:

- moved house
- changed your name
- turned 18 recently
- become an Australian citizen
- not yet joined the electoral roll or

want to check or update your enrolment details

How to vote

Optional preferential voting is the voting system used in local government elections. This means you have the choice to number the candidates in the order of your preference. You do not have to number all the boxes if you don't want to.

You have the choice to:

- vote for one candidate by putting a 1 next to their name
- vote for some candidates by numbering several candidates in the order of your preference vote for all candidates in the order of your preference

Who can vote

<u>Residents</u>

All residents in the Shire of Cuballing who are enrolled on the State electoral roll are automatically enrolled on the Shire's local government roll. You must make sure you are correctly enrolled, and your details are up to date by 5pm 22 August to vote in the local government elections.

Owners and Occupiers

People who own or occupy rateable property within the Shire of Cuballing local government district can apply to be included on the roll as an owner/occupier, as long as they are eligible electors. Where a company or body corporate owns or occupies rateable land, up to two people can be enrolled to vote on its behalf.

On the Ground – Future Ready Farming

Future Ready Farming Kicks Off with Four Demonstration Sites.

We've wrapped up the first season of our Future Ready Farming project, an initiative focused on supporting landholders to transition to climate smart agriculture.

This year, we established four demonstration sites in Marradong, Quindanning, Mundijong, and West Coolup, showcasing regenerative practices including cover cropping, multi-species and perennial pastures, biologically orientated fertility, and mob grazing.

Despite a late season break, the timing aligned well with contractor availability, and the final site was seeded on 29th May, just as rain began, ideal conditions for germination. We worked closely with Agroecologist Mark Tupman (Productive Ecology) to develop two specially developed pasture mixes, prepare a compost slurry mix enriched with Mycorrhizal fungi, seaweed granules, and a trace element solution, tailored to the specific conditions at each site.

Soil sampling transects have been established, baseline soil tests have been completed, and we will return annually over the next three years to conduct indicator tests, plant tissue tests and track soil health improvements. We're now working closely with each landholder on follow-up treatments based on initial observations and test results.

All of this is being documented

by video which we will be sharing very soon! Keep an eye out on our socials and You-Tube channel.

We plan to support more landholders with this work over the next 3 years, stayed tuned for updates.

Why did the fish climb the ladder?

These photos are of the fish ladder constructed in 2013 at the Boddington weir, when there were only very few examples of structures like this in south west WA. Fish ladders or 'fish ways' are designed and installed when there are physical barriers to migration in our rivers (such as weirs). For example, our little native fish the western minnow migrates upstream to spawn, and although it can jump small barriers, it is far too small to do that when it comes across large obstacles. Fish ladders provide the perfect gradient for these and other migratory fish species to continue upstream uninterrupted.

On the whole, our rivers are degraded due to various impacts and need our help, which can be in the form of

interventions such as these sorts of instream structures, bank stabilisation, and protecting and enhancing riverine vegetation. Sometimes this can also be in the form of high impact activities like sediment removal. which the Shire of Boddington is currently carrying out above the weir on the Hotham River. Semi-permanent and permanent pools are going to become more and more important refuge areas for aquatic species as our climate becomes hotter and drier, and a suite of interventions to enhance them is sometimes required, in addition to adding vegetation and shade. These always need to be carefully planned and approved by relevant authorities. Signs of Breeding White-tailed Black Cockatoos – We need your help!

Finding suitable breeding hollows is huge investment for Black Cockatoos, spending up to 8 months searching, As we emerge from winter they become most active in their search for hollows. While Carnaby Black Cockatoos tend to prefer the Swan Coastal Plain for breeding, we know they are breeding in areas around Dryandra, Boddington, Crossman and Wandering. For both White-tailed Black Cockatoos (Baudin's and Carnaby's) in the

broader Hotham-Williams area, we have much to learn about their abundance, distribution and breeding locations. Please keep your eyes peeled for breeding behaviour and never underestimate the value of old, dead stag trees for black cockatoo breeding. At this time of year, if you see a pair of White-tailed Black Cockatoos hanging around a large tree hollow on your property or nearby Reserve, and persistently coming back to the hollow with nesting

material, please let our team know at <u>admin@peel-harvey.org.</u> <u>au</u>. This information helps us to work with local landholders to protect critical breeding habitat in the Hotham-Williams area.



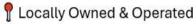


