

#### **COUNCIL SHORTS**

#### **Ordinary Council Meeting held 18th June 2025**

#### Firebreak Notice 2025-26

Council approved the Shire of Cuballing's Bush Fire Advisory Committee (BFAC) recommendation to adopt the 2025-26 Firebreak Notice (Order), once again including the requirement for townsite and rural residential lots to have both firebreaks and be cleared of all debris and flammable material to a height not more than 50mm.

#### 2025 WA Local Government Association Convention & Annual General Meeting

Each year the Western Australian Local Government Association (WALGA) holds its Annual General Meeting in conjunction with its annual Convention. Once again, the Convention is being held at the Perth Exhibition and Convention Centre from Monday 22nd to Wednesday 24th September 2025. The council nominated Cr Eliza Dowling and Cr Adrian Kowald as the two voting delegates for the AGM, with the CEO Mr Chris Paget as the proxy.

#### **Temporary Accommodation Policy**

Council resolved to adopt a temporary accommodation policy, application fee, and new guidelines to be incorporated into the Shire of Cuballing Policy Manual. This policy will provide guidance to support applications seeking approval for various forms of temporary accommodation on private property or in an area other than a caravan park.

Changes to extend local government approval powers under WA's Caravan Parks and Camping Regulations came into effect on 1 September 2024. The reforms streamline the application process for temporary accommodation approvals on private property, cut red tape and offer more flexibility for local governments. Previously, local governments could only provide approvals for a maximum of 3 months, or up to 12 months if the proposed arrangement was in a caravan and the person had a building or demolition permit. Standard camping approvals for longer than 3 months required a separate application to the Minister for Local Government.

Benefits of the simplified process include:

- no approval required if a person intends to camp on private property for 5 days or less;
- applications for longer periods can seek approval from the relevant local government rather than the Minister for Local Government;
- subject to inspections, local governments can now approve all camping applications for up to 24 months;
- applicants may re-apply to the local government on expiry of an approval;
- local governments can revoke approvals if an applicant fails to meet the conditions of approval.

All applicants will still need to satisfy the existing conditions for these approvals, including meeting health and safety requirements set out in the Caravan Parks and Camping Grounds Regulations 1997. Special approval from the Minister for Local Government will still be required if more than one proposed caravan, mobile home, bus or tiny home on wheels is proposed to be placed on a private lot.

The Minister for Local Government will retain the power to consider camping approvals in instances where a local government does not provide an approval or revokes an approval. The object of the draft policy and guidelines is to provide a consistent approach to the management of caravan and camping requirements under the amended regulations.

#### **COUNCIL SHORTS**

#### **Development Approval – Solar Power Farm**

Council granted development approval for the construction and operation of an 800kW ground-mounted solar photovoltaic (PV) power facility at Hillcroft Farms, 1395 Yornaning West Road, Cuballing (lots 7740 and 13054). The proposal includes installation of solar panels, inverters, and associated infrastructure, and the underground routing of a powerline to connect to the main switchboard at the feedmill site.

The proposed solar farm involves:

- Installation of approximately 1,356 ground-mounted PV panels over a designated area within the existing agricultural lot;
- Deployment of 5 inverters (each rated at 100kW), supported by steel/aluminium mounting structures and concrete pads; - Cabling and trenching for electrical connectivity and control;
- The underground powerline connection from the PV array to the main switchboard across Yornaning Road, necessitating the creation of an easement The project is designed to meet renewable energy and environmental goals for on-farm power generation, improving self-sufficiency and reducing reliance on grid electricity. The following conditions were imposed:
- 1. Development must be undertaken in accordance with approved plans.
- 2. An easement agreement for the underground powerline must be executed prior to works.
- 3. All electrical cabling must be underground and compliant.
- 4. A decommissioning bond must be lodged prior to commissioning.
- 5. Site restoration must occur following decommissioning.

#### **Employment Contract Renewal – Manager Works & Services**

Council reappointed Mr Bruce Brennan as Manager Works and Services (MWS) of the Shire of Cuballing in December for a five-year term effective 1 July 2025 through to 30 June 2030.

Debbie was happy to have her brother the late Elder Greg Thorne remembered, with photos of his involvement in local projects, and recorded recollections from him about local areas such as Tunbridge Gully and Camballing Reserve.

The gorgeous artwork of the Wagyl was created by 'Miss Debbie' and the year 6's at the Boddington District High School. The Wagyl is the maker and protector of waterways and winds its way through Dreamtime and more recent reimagining of Noongar cultural stories, reminding us of the never-ending connection between water, land and people.

PHCC aims to work with our Noongar people and communities in identifying and protecting sites of cultural significance. Both the Camballing Reserve and Tunbridge Gully projects are located in a landscape rich in Noongar cultural sites of

significance, and the rehabilitation of those areas to remove invasive plants and revegetate with species that belong there will help to acknowledge and pay respect to Country.
