

CUBALLING EAST ROAD UPGRADE – FINAL SECTION

The Cuballing East Road Upgrade has reached an important milestone with the completion of the final section. After returning from their Christmas break, the Shire's External Works crew promptly resumed work on the project. They expressed great satisfaction in sealing the last portion of this significant undertaking, marking the official completion of the major construction works.

Outstanding Works

Although the primary construction is now finished, some final tasks remain. These include the installation of safety signage and the application of line markings, which will further enhance the safety and clarity of the upgraded road.

Project Timeline and Funding

Progress on the Cuballing East Road Upgrade was influenced by seasonal weather conditions, which determined both the timing and extent of work that could be carried out each year. The project was deliberately scheduled to avoid major roadworks during the winter months, ensuring optimal construction conditions. Commencing in 2022, the project operated with an estimated budget of approximately \$8 million. Funding was provided by the Federal Government as part of the Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Network initiative.

Key Outcomes and Benefits

The project has resulted in the delivery of a first-class road capable of withstanding the significant heavy freight traffic that passes through the district. In addition to the improved infrastructure, the Shire benefited from the opportunity to upgrade its major road plant machinery. Furthermore, staff members gained valuable experience and skills in quality road construction, contributing to the ongoing development of local expertise.

COUNCIL SHORTS

Ordinary Council Meeting held 17th December 2025

Annual Review of Delegations

Council endorsed and adopted the review of the Delegations Register for 2025-26. The aim of delegated authority is to assist with improving the time taken to make decisions subject to any constraints determined by Council or by the relevant legislation. The Delegations Register is consistent with legislation and the Shire's Strategic Community Plan directions. It assists Council to achieve its obligations at law to carry out the statutory responsibilities of Local Government and thus maximise service to members of the public, residents and ratepayers.

Policy Review – 3.14 Continuing Elected Member Professional Development

As part of the State Government's review of the *Local Government Act 1995*, Council was required to adopt an Elected Member Continuing Professional Development Policy. The Council endorsed the review of the existing policy, noting no changes were needed.

The introduction of mandatory training for candidates and Elected Members occurred in 2019-20. The changes to the Act also require Councils to adopt a policy in relation to the continuing professional development of Elected Members with a requirement for that Policy to be published on the local government website. The Department of Local Government, Industry Regulation and Safety (LGIRS) has subsequently advised that all Council Members will need to complete the Council Member Essentials training course within 12 months of being elected. The course has been developed to provide Council Members with the skills and knowledge to perform their roles as leaders in their district.

Disability Access and Improvement Plan 2025-2030

Council reviewed and adopted the new Shire of Cuballing Disability Access and Improvement Plan for 2025-2030.

The Western Australia *Disability Services Act 1993* requires all Local Governments to develop and implement a Disability Access and Inclusion Plan (DAIP) to ensure that people with disabilities have equal access to its facilities and services. The Shire of Cuballing adopted its first DAIP plan in 1995; the new DAIP reflects current legislative requirements, community needs, and emerging priorities.

Bush Fire Risk Management Plan 2026-2028

The Council received and endorsed the review of the updated draft Shire of Cuballing Bush Fire Risk Management Plan for the period 2026-2028.

As a part of the requirements for the Shire to receive Mitigation Activity Funding (MAF), a review of the Bushfire Risk Management Plan (BRMP) is required. This plan has recently taken a new format to ensure all plans are inline within the state and to capture extra information. The development of a Bushfire Risk Management Plan (BRM Plan) is essential for Shires like Cuballing, where a combination of forest reserves, fragmented remnant vegetation, ageing populations, vulnerable infrastructure, and widespread agricultural operations create complex risk profiles. It incorporates a comprehensive risk register, a treatment schedule, and a communication plan, ensuring the community is informed and empowered to participate in their own safety.

Housing Development Proposal – Regional Housing Support Fund

Council authorised the preparation of a comprehensive application to the Regional Housing Support Fund (including business case and cost-benefit analysis) for the proposed construction of 5 x housing units at 66 and 74 Austral Street in Cuballing.

Special Council Meeting held 22nd December 2025

At the special Council meeting, Council received and adopted the Annual Report and Auditors Report for the 2024-25 financial year. The date for the AGM of Electors was also set for 4th February 2026.

In addition, work is progressing on upgrading the old kitchen facilities in the Cuby Agricultural Hall. These improvements will enhance the design and layout of the space, creating better experience for those who hire the venue.

This year, the Australia Day breakfast was hosted at Popanyinning Oval, where approximately forty people gathered to enjoy a breakfast prepared by Councillors Scott Ballantyne and Rob Harris. Stay Informed

Fire Bans are applied when necessary, by the Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES) and are widely reported in the media for everyone to follow. However, Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans are declared locally by the Shire of Cuballing if the weather conditions warrant it. These vehicle bans not only apply to farmers and their machinery, but also to smaller landholders with quad bikes, trail bikes, and off-road vehicles. Some early fires this summer were started by children on off-road bikes.

NRM is the management of natural resources such as land, water, soils, plants and animals. It brings together land use planning, water management, biodiversity conservation and sustainability of industries such as agriculture, mining, tourism, fisheries and forestry.



Feral cat control near Dryandra Woodland National Park

Feral cats have played a major role in 27 of the 34 mammal extinctions in Australia since colonisation. Feral cats continue to kill at least 815 million mammals, 265 million birds and 466 million reptiles every year in Australia.

A Defending Dryandra 4G monitoring camera installed on the boundary of farmland and Dryandra Woodland National park has captured images of numbats and chuditch but unfortunately also shows there are still feral cats in the area, which continue to be a significant threat to both of these threatened species.

Through PHCC's Defending Dryandra – Feral Hotspots Project 59 feral cats have been culled on properties near Dryandra Woodland National Park since control started in May 2024. A pest animal control contractor

conducts 20 hours per month of control on 3 properties that were determined to be feral cat hot spots. One of the feral cats culled was a massive 10kg, the biggest feral cat the pest animal control contractor has culled to date.

PHCC's Numbat Neighbourhood Project complements the Defending Dryandra Project and allows the pest animal control contractor to conduct additional control on properties surrounding Dryandra Woodland NP, in total between the 2 projects 79 feral cats and 119 foxes have been culled since May 2024. 


