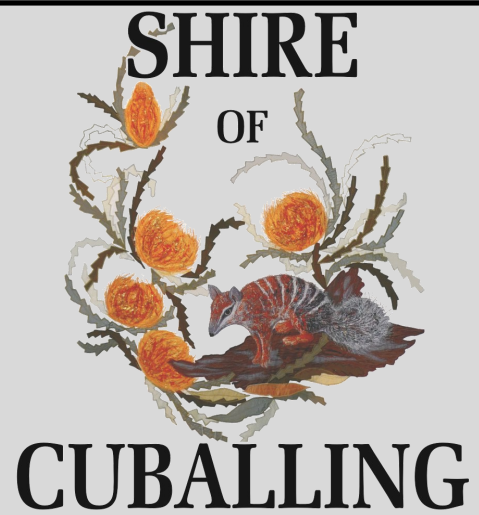

# PRESIDENTS PEN

## Fire Permits

Following the recent visit to Western Australia by Cyclone Narelle, it may be hard to imagine bushfires being a concern. However, we are still in the **Restricted** Burning Period as farmers prepare paddocks for seeding. Permits must be obtained from a local Fire Protection Officer before any burning can commence. Permit holders are also required to notify neighbours and log the proposed burn with the Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES) as a controlled burn.

So far, our Shire has experienced a relatively quiet fire season. Let's keep it that way for a few more weeks.

## Winners Are Grinners

It was only a month ago that the Cuballing Cricket Club was anticipating an early end to their season. However, a run of late wins, combined with other results going their way, saw them finish second on the premiership ladder.

A trip to Wandering for the Grand Final resulted in the club bringing home the trophy. Congratulations to the team and their supporters on a very successful season.

## Stray Cats

There has been an increase in sightings of stray cats in recent months, particularly around the Popanyinning townsite. Unfortunately, there is evidence of wildlife, including birds, being killed, which is not what anyone wants.

Concerned, residents are now planning to trap cats on their properties. If your cat does not have a collar or is not microchipped, there is a risk it may be considered feral. Please do the right thing by registering your cats and keeping them safe, secure, and indoors at night.

# COUNCIL SHORTS

## Comment regarding Deputy CEO Suspension

You may be aware of recent media reports regarding the Shire's new appointed Deputy CEO Mr Sam Curulli being charged with offences relating to his former employment role at the Shire of Coorow and other matters. Whilst extremely serious in nature, it is important to note that these charges are nothing to do with, and did not occur at, the Shire of Cuballing. Mr Curulli commenced the role on 16<sup>th</sup> March and was only in our office for 1.5 days before we became aware of his arrest and subsequent court appearance through a WA Police media release; he was immediately suspended and barred from accessing our office and systems whilst we undertake investigations to establish more facts around the matter in order to determine what further action may be necessary.

## Ordinary Council Meeting held 18<sup>th</sup> March 2026

### Updated Codes of Conduct for Council Members and Employees

Council reviewed and adopted the new Shire of Cuballing Code of Conduct for Council Members, Committee Members and Candidates.

With the introduction of the new Local Government Inspector's Office, amendments to the *Local Government Act 1995* and associated regulations took effect on the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2026, which included changes to the Model Code of Conduct. These changes required Local Governments to amend their existing Code of Conduct to incorporate the new changes by the 31<sup>st</sup> March 2026, and the CEO must then publish the updated Code on the Shire website.

The changes relate substantially to the role of the Local Government Inspector and the manner in which any complaints about a breach of the Council's Code of Conduct are dealt with. These have been highlighted in the attached document. As a result of this, additional changes will also be required to Council's Behavioural Breach complaint forms and our associated Complaints Management Policy and procedures. These changes will be presented to Council for consideration at a later date.

Council also adopted an amended Code of Conduct for Employees which clarifies approval, disclosure and compliance requirements for employees engaging in secondary employment, thereby strengthening governance controls, mitigate conflict of interest risks, and provide clearer administrative processes for both employees and management.

### 2025-26 Annual Budget Review

The Council adopted the 2025-26 Annual Budget review. The Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996, Regulation 33A requires that local governments conduct a budget review between 1 January and the last day of February in each financial year. Upon adoption, a copy of the review and determination is to be provided to the Department of Local Government within 14 days thereafter. This review considers the Shire's current financial position as of 28 February 2026 and projects an updated annual budget position by the end of the financial year via thorough review of current accounts, forecast expenditure levels and income projections.

### WALGA Electoral Reform Consultation

The Western Australian Local Government Association (WALGA) sought feedback from local governments to inform a sector-wide response to anticipated State Government proposals relating to local government electoral reform. Council made some minor changes then endorsed a submission outlining the Shire of Cuballing's position on proposed electoral reform matters, including council spill provisions, voting systems, councillor terms, and voting methods.

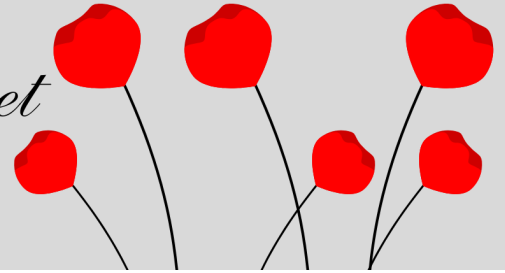

Cricket Grand Final – 21 March 2026  
Cuballing Win Exciting Match

After being defeated by Wandering in the second semi final and a hard fought preliminary final win against Williams the following week, the boys advanced for a re-match against Wandering in the grand final.

Joe Dowling, the Cuballing captain continued his success in winning the toss and decided to bat.

Andrew Harris and Byron Blevin opened the innings and secured a good start before Andrew Harris was dismissed. The score had reached 45. A good opening stand.

Kendal Ballard joined Blevin and when he was dismissed without any addition to the score Joe Dowling joined Blevin and these two took the score to 97 before Dowling was caught off the bowling of Bailey Parsons for 20. Brock Francis then joined Blevin but it was Blevin who was anchoring the scoring. Good running was keeping the scoreboard ticking over and when Francis was dismissed for 5 the score was 117.

Rhett Ballard joined Blevin and both batsmen sensing the need to push the scoring along continued with some good shots all around the ground. Boundaries were hard to get as the field placings by Wandering were restricting runs.

When Ballard was dismissed for 15 these two had taken the score to 151 and this left next batsman Beven George to join Blevin. Blevin brought up his 100 to a great cheer from the Cuballing supporters and with a further runs the score reached 170. These two continued running scoring valuable runs and frustrating the fielders and when George hit two mighty sixes the Cuballing innings came to an end with a total of 5/192.

Both players finished not out with Blevin on 103 and George 29. It was an exceptional innings by Blevin and more so because of the conditions.

After the tea break Wandering openers of Schorer and Blake Egerton –Warburton opened for Wandering and scoring runs against the Cuballing pace attack was not going to be easy. Brock Francis made the first breakthrough when he had Egerton-Warburton caught by Kendal Ballard when they had posted 19 runs. Lewis Parsons was the next to go caught by Andrew Harris off Damon Watt and then he had Jacob Schorer caught by wicketkeeper Rhett Ballard for 21. The score was 3 for 39. Damon Watt was bowling exceptionally well from the northern end.

Ben Sherry and Ben McMillan came together and these two started to look dangerous. Ben McMillan was the first to fall to the Rhett Ballard -Damon Watt combination and it was another 30 runs before Joe Dowling snared the prize wicket of Sherry caught by Tom Fleay.

Bailey Parsons and Troy Egerton–Warburton were proving a headache for the bowlers until Egerton–Warburton was bowled by Bryon Blevin for 20. Wandering were 6/148 and starting to become a real problem for Cuballing.

When Joe Dowling ran out Bailey Parsons for 52 and Kendal Ballard removed William Bchorer caught by Michael Moore for 2 the score had reached 8/176.

As luck was now going Cuballing's way, Brock Francis run out Jordan Hughes and when Francis came on to complete his final overs Cuballing required 1 wicket and Wandering needed 7 runs.

When Brock Francis came on to bowl the final over the batsmen added two runs and then as often happens in a tight situation Francis responded and had Brennan caught at the wicket by Rhett Ballard for 3, leaving Wandering 5 runs short. The not out batsman was Bchulz on 2, The final score –Cuballing 5/192 and Wandering 10/187

Damon Watt – 3 for 43 off 10 overs  
Joe Dowling – 1 for 47 off 10 overs  
Tom Fleay – 0 for 38 off 7 overs (including dropped catch)  
Kendal Ballard – 1 for 22 off 5 overs  
Byron Blevin – 1 for 17 off 3 overs

Byron Blevin was named Man of the Match with his 103no and 1 wicket. It was an outstanding performance by Byron Blevin and one that will be remembered for a long time. He was at the crease from start to finish. He took on the Wandering bowlers as they tried desperately to claim his wicket, but Byron kept his composure, reached his 100 to the roar of the crowd and with Bevan George at the end, they brought the team home for a wonderful win.

Players from both Clubs put in an outstanding effort and must be congratulated on a very close and exciting game.

The wind up was held on Saturday the 28<sup>th</sup> March and award winners are as follows

Batting Average, Batting Aggregate, Bowling Average, Bowling Aggregate, and Cricketer of the Year were all won by Brock Francis.

# Landcare matters

NRM is the management of natural resources such as land, water, soils, plants and animals. It brings together land use planning, water management, biodiversity conservation and sustainability of industries such as agriculture, mining, tourism, fisheries and forestry.



## Seed collecting is a tricky business

Over the summer months, we collected various species of seed and plant material to be propagated and subsequently planted at our rehabilitation sites on the Hotham and Williams Rivers.

We are working with Nuts About Natives (a local plant nursery) to process and propagate the plant material. The new plants will be used to revegetate the same areas the material originally came from, increasing plant density in these locations. This important work ensures local genetics of the plants and characteristics specific to surviving within Hotham and Williams Rivers sites.

Seed collecting and plant propagation can be a tricky business. It starts with the requirement for a licence granted by DBCA to collect material from native plant species, and written permission of the land owners from areas you would like to collect it.

An understanding of which species should be targeted, what parts of the plants are best to collect for successful propagation and what is the optimum timing for collection is necessary. Treatments and potential need for storage of plant material also needs to be a consideration.

So far, our team have collected rhizomes, fresh seed, dried/ripe seed and cuttings of the following species, *Sporobolus virginicus* (native couch grass), *Eleocharis acuta* (common spikerush) *Dianella revoluta* (blueberry lily), and *Tecticornia sp.* (samphire). These were delivered to the nursery and the material was processed accordingly. For example, the native couch grass rhizomes were divided and potted whilst still fresh from the Williams River. The samphire will be dried and sieved to extract seed material for germination.

We are relying heavily on the expertise of the nursery, and trial and error in terms of what we collect, and when we collect it – making lots of notes along the way to make improvements for next year.

We look forward to planting these species back into their local areas and watch them grow in the years to come.

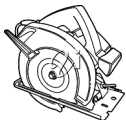

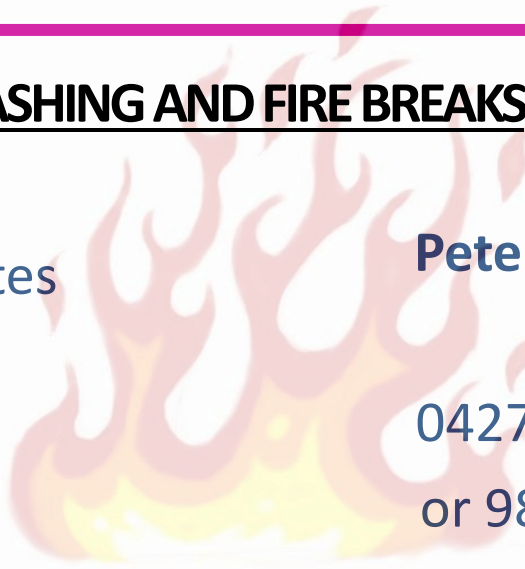
